The course will cover 5 NCEA Achievement Standards (3 internal and 2 external Students will also have the option of choosing to sit the Scholarship Examination at the end of the year. 	Scholarship candidates are expected to demonstrate high-level critical thinking abstraction and generalisation, and to integrate, synthesise and apply knowled skills, understanding, and ideas to complex situations.										
	There are no NCEA credits attached to NZ Scholarship. Instead, New Zealand Scholarship provides recognition and monetary reward to top students in their last year of schooling. Scholarship awards are paid in the first year of tertiary study in New Zealand. The award for a single subject is \$500. Higher amounts are awarded to students who gain Scholarship in three subjects with 'Outstanding' in at least two subjects. There is also an award for the top scholar in each subject.
