What is the LEAD program and what is its purpose?

• LEAD (Leadership, Education and Development) Program is a Sewa International Volunteer Development Program for incoming & current high school students (Grade 8-12). • It is designed for the holistic development of teenagers. It provides a platform for participants to serve the greater community and experience the joy of giving.

• It introduces socially conscious leadership in youngsters.

How do I register & pay the fees?

- Registration is open from **Dec 1 2023 Dec 31 2023**. There are limited seats available on a first-come first-serve basis.
- Fees are \$100 per student

What are the benefits to the participant?

Who can participate in the LEAD program?

- High School Students (incoming or current) current 8th through 12th graders.
- Students and Parents need to be fully committed to the values of Sewa and the LEAD program.

- Parental involvement is required. (At Least 20 hours)
- Sewa is a Hindu faith-based organization and provides equal opportunity to people of all racial, ethnic, religious and gender backgrounds to participate.

What is the duration of the program & what are the important dates / time?

- Duration: Jan Oct , 2024

- Commitment: Perform at least 50 hours of volunteering (~2 hrs. / week)

Will the activities be Virtual or Physical?

Most of the development activities will be virtual, but service events will be a combination of in-person and virtual. All safety precautions will be followed with only healthy participants without any symptoms being allowed to participate.

Can I participate over summer break only?

Although several activities will be over summer, it will be very unlikely to cover our goal of 100 hrs. of volunteering. Therefore, it is recommended to be active for the entire duration of the program. The activities planned are for more than 100 hrs. and so you will have a choice to select activities based on your availability. Our activities are planned considering the school schedule of high schoolers.

How many hours do I have to spend on any project that I choose?

There is no choice of projects, but activities support multiple projects and so plan to spend a minimum of 50 hours of volunteering.

How do I manage volunteer hours?

This will be managed by the Sewa LEAD coordinators.

Can my friends / family participate in LEAD activities without registering for the LEAD program?

Your friends & family members can participate in activities which are open to the public. We highly encourage Parents, family & friends to get connected with Sewa International – Phoenix Chapter as a volunteer and contribute to serving the society.

What are the details of Certificates and President's Volunteer Service

Awards? • We are glad to present a recognition certificate by the President of Sewa International USA to all participants who fulfill the criteria irrespective of US immigration status.

- President's Volunteer Service Award (PVSA). We will nominate participants depending on eligibility and total volunteer hours, but this should not be a criterion for participation.

 Only US Citizens and Permanent Residents are eligible for PVSA.
 - Award type is as per the rules available in this link -> <u>https://www.presidentialserviceawards.gov/eligibility</u>
 - For both Sewa Certificate and PVSA, eligible volunteer hours are considered within the current calendar year only.
 - Hours cannot be rolled over to next year.
 - Services performed within Sewa LEAD program will only be counted.
 - Number of hours for activities including will be decided by LEAD Coordinators.
