Standards and Assessment:

A. Assessments:

- **ACT Aspire Preliminary scores released:**
 - 2022-2023 ACT Aspire Preliminary Summary Scores Extended (XLSX) July 20, 2023
- **❖** ATLAS Updates:
 - The summative test will be adaptive within grade levels.
 - The test will be untimed but will have an estimated time to test.
 - Science Interim testing will be available in September. ELA and Math Interim testing will not be available until 2024-25.
 - The test will be fully aligned with Arkansas standards.
 - The classroom tool will be available in August.

***** K-2 Assessments

- 2023-2024 is the final year on the contracts for the current K-2 assessments.
- In 2024-2025, new assessments will be available for K-2 and <u>may</u> include a universal screener at the beginning of the year with some through-year interim assessments to help with the requirements of AR LEARNS.

B. Revised Standards:

- ❖ ELA and math standards are to be implemented in the 2023-2024 school year. We are typically given a year for implementation, but since these standards will be the foundation for the new assessments in the spring of 2024, instruction must be on the same standards.

C. Literacy/Reading:

- ❖ Due to the LEARNS Act, the Literacy Specialists will be assigned to schools with a D/F rating. GFESC Literacy Specialists will try to meet the needs of all districts/schools, but please be aware that the Literacy Specialists may not be as accessible to schools with A-C ratings.
- ❖ Writing Revolution Cohorts are again being offered this year by DESE. Teachers will be in either the K-2 or 3-12 cohort, and all sessions are virtual. For more information, see the links below:

- **❖ The deadline for Science of Reading Proficiency is here.** All K-6 core content teachers, ELL, Reading Specialists, and K-12 special education teachers must be proficient.

Important Deadline

All educators must be coded as proficient or aware by Cycle 2 of 2023-2024 school year.

Cycle 2 opens October 1st and closes October 15th.

Once an educator has been coded as proficient or aware, they will not need to be coded again.

D. Social Studies:

❖ The 2023-24 school year is "soft implementation" for the new Social Studies standards. 2024-25 is "full implementation."

E. Math:

G. **Special Education:**

- ❖ Inclusive Practices, K-6: Beginning this school year (23-24), the majority of students in K-6 should be spending the majority of their day in the general education classroom. Schools may still offer resource classes, but they should be in addition to core instruction and not replace it.

The special education novice training is optional for any special educator who is a novice special educator and is offered in addition to the required novice training for teachers who are in their first 3 years of education. The special education novice training is designed for educators who are in their first three years of teaching special education, regardless of how many years they have taught previously. It is also available to any veteran special education teacher who needs further training and support in the topics covered. This training is conducted by Audrey Kengla, Behavior Support Specialist for Guy Fenter, as well as Amber Quillman, Special Education Supervisor for Ozark and Mansfield Schools. Becky Ballard, School Psychology Specialist for Guy Fenter, will also be contributing.

Topics covered in the novice special education training are specific to the needs of those who are **new to teaching special education,** such as behavior management strategies, ABA strategies, due process, IEPs, data collection, etc.

ESSA and Accountability:

- The Assessment Corrections Engine (ACE) will be open from August 7-21, 2023 (15 days). During this time, districts can submit documentation through the portal to remove students that may not be expected to test. Making corrections earlier in this window will give our team the time to offer support or provide feedback.

❖ Licensure Waiver Fee for a first-time license: The State Board of Education has approved a waiver of first-time teacher licensure application fees for the following



period: <u>May 1, 2023 – August 31, 2023.</u> Graduates should continue to apply for the standard license through the online application but will not be asked to pay the application fee before submitting.

Other Information:

J. Act 538

- Upon the issuance of an initial teaching license, an applicant shall obtain training in the following areas within the first two years of initial employment, unless they have received training in a separate ed prep program and can provide evidence of completing training:
 - Mandated reporting
 - Family and community engagement



- Teen suicide awareness and prevention
- AR History
- Human trafficking
- Certified staff will be required to receive training in these areas one time only. Certified staff who have completed these trainings do not have to take it again.

Family and community engagement

AR History (except as may be required for the subject matter she/he teaches)

- In the 2023-2024 school year and every 5th year thereafter, certified staff shall receive training in the following:
 - Mandated reporter (originally every 4th year after 2013-14)
 - Mental health awareness
 - Teen suicide awareness and prevention
- 2023-2024 School Year: 2 hours Bullying Prevention <u>AND</u> 2 hours of Suicide Awareness.
- Per Michelle Johnson at DESE, hold off on doing Child Maltreatment, unless you do it every year. She believes they will clean this up in the forthcoming rules.
- Licensed employees cannot be required to attend PD beyond 60 hours each year according to the new law.
