Graduates pursue innovative solutions to complex problems via media and technology literacy, numerical fluency, and scientific accuracy.

Agency: Independent & Empowered Citizens - From 1821 to 1844, the S. Gildersleeve and Sons Company produced 135 vessels on the Connecticut River in Portland, Connecticut. Portland's Gildersleeve Shipbuilders were renowned for their sturdy craftsmanship, entrepreneurship, civic mindedness, philanthropy, and ingenuity which benefit our community to this day. Like these inspiring craftspeople, Portland's graduates are independent and empowered citizens. They maintain lofty personal expectations while demonstrating a growth mindset and commitment to wellbeing rooted in and a clear conception of self-worth.

Student Life

Arrival and Dismissal

School doors open at **7:20** for Portland Middle School, with supervision starting at 7:30. We kindly ask that parents refrain from dropping their children off prior to that time. Parents dropping off their children after 7:45 or dismissing them prior to 2:15, must enter the building to sign them in/out.

Athletics and Extracurricular

At Portland Middle School, we maintain a standard of excellence for all student athletes and extracurricular club-members. Coaches and club leaders are responsible for communicating after-school attendance and behavior expectations. Students are responsible for ensuring transportation home at appropriate times. Students are required to sign up on FamilyID and have an up to date physical to participate in athletics.

Attendance Policy

At Portland Middle School, attendance in the classroom and daily activities is important to a student's ability to learn. In the event of an absence, students are expected to make up necessary work upon return. In the event of an extended absence, work may be sent home or posted digitally for completion at home.

- Students are only allowed up to 10 excused absences over the course of a school year, and must be excused by a parent/guardian. 2 of those days may be used as mental health days.
- Students are considered tardy after 7:45 am. Every tardy in a quarter after 3 will result in an after school detention.

Bullying

At Portland Middle School, bullying will not be tolerated. According to Board of Education Policy, bullying in Portland Schools is defined as the repeated use by one or more students of a written, oral or electronic communication, such as cyber bullying, directed at or referring to another student attending school in the same school district or a physical act or gesture by one or more students repeatedly directed at another student attending school in the same school district that:

- Causes physical or emotional harm to such student or damage to such student's property,
- Places such student in reasonable fear of harm to himself or herself, or of damage to his or her property,
- Creates a hostile environment at school for such student,
- Infringes on the rights of such student at school, or
- Substantially disrupts the education process or the orderly operation of a school.

Acts of bullying will be promptly reviewed in accordance with Board of Education Policy. If acts of bullying are found to be true, quick actions will be taken and all members of the action will partake in activities to restore the school culture back to its standard of excellence.

Cafeteria

At Portland Middle School, students are expected to follow necessary rules for student comfort and safety. Students are expected to abide by the following, which will be described and enforced by the lunch duty staff:

- Follow seating procedures, not going over the max number of students at a table
- Retrieve and purchase school provided lunch, if necessary, at the time and with the behavior expected
- Remain seated during lunch, with expectation of raising hands to request to leave the table

• Clean the table and area around the table before leaving, taking responsibility for messes and trash that are created during lunch

An inability to follow these rules will result in students being given an alternate setting to eat, where student comfort and safety isn't at risk.

Chromebook Management

At Portland Middle School, the expectation is for students to bring their Chromebook device to school everyday. Devices should be:

- Fully charged (bring charger to school just in case)
- In a protective case
- Used for school work and school-related activities only

Students are responsible for the physical care of their device, as well as their digital citizenship. Students should follow the rules and expectations laid out in the <u>District Acceptable Use Agreement</u>.

Dress Code

At Portland Middle School, students are expected to attend school in appropriate dress that meets health and safety standards and does not interfere with the learning process or contradict the educational mission of the school. The school prohibits attire that bears any expression or insignia which:

- Are obscene or libelous
- Advocates for prejudice toward any group (i.e racial, religious, gender, etc...)
- Displays drugs, alcohol, sexual content, weapons or acts of violence
- Displays evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang

Additionally, students must wear clothes that cover their undergarments. Students are encouraged to have a jacket or sweatshirt in their locker, should they need to change or cover up clothes that violate the dress code. Blankets are not permitted. The administration shall have the authority to require a student to change his/her attire should it be deemed inappropriate according to the above guidelines.

Homework and Grading

The general guideline of "10 minutes per grade" is utilized when planning homework assignments. Oftentimes this will include long term projects that are expected to be completed over multiple days both within and outside of the classroom. Teachers will appropriately monitor, evaluate, and provide feedback to students on homework assignments within a reasonable amount of time. Missing work can result in a 50% grade on an assignment, if not turned in.

Each department develops their own grading protocols that will be communicated to parents at the start of the year. These must be consistent within the department and weigh the objective assessment of learning more heavily than homework completion.

Nursing

At Portland Middle School, students are allowed and encouraged to see the nurse for various physical or mental health reasons. Please note: if students and parents would like students to take medications in school, parental permission is needed.

Phones and Electronic Devices

At Portland Middle School, phones and other electronic devices that are not the district-assigned Chromebook are prohibited in the classroom. Teachers may give permission for phones for instructional purposes, but they must otherwise remain in a locker or at home. The school will collect and hold a student's phone in the event that it is deemed disruptive to the classroom. To ensure phones are not being used to play videos or music, anything that covers the ears(hoods) is not allowed. Should a phone be confiscated:

- 1st occurrence: A student may retrieve their phone at the end of the day.
- 2nd occurrence: A parent will be notified to pick up their child's phone directly.
- 3rd occurrence and beyond: A behavior plan will be put in place that requires the student to leave their cell phone at home, or leave it in the office.

We have hard-wired phones in all of our classrooms. Parents who need to contact their child during the school day are encouraged to call our front office, where we can immediately connect you with your child if needed or get them a message from you.

Physical Education and Health

At Portland Middle School, all students have two quarters of Physical Education and Health in both their 7th and 8th Grade year. Students must dress appropriately for P.E. classes. Proper attire consists of a T-shirt, sneakers, socks, and gym shorts or pants. If

students cannot participate in the physical education program, a physician's note, or note from the school nurse will be required to excuse them.
