

USE A CONCISE AND INFORMATIVE TITLE IN TITLE CASE

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Abstrak

Abstrak harus memberikan gambaran yang jelas terkait isi artikel. Abstrak harus memuat tujuan pengabdian, metode yang digunakan, temuan penting atau hasil pengabdian, dan kesimpulan. Penulis juga disarankan untuk menambahkan sedikit ulasan masalah pengabdian di awal abstrak sebagai pengantar. Abstrak ditulis dengan huruf tegak dengan panjang 150-250 kata. Jika abstrak melebihi 250 kata, maka editor akan meminta penulis harus memperbaikinya. Pada kondisi tertentu editor memiliki hak untuk memperbaiki abstrak agar sesuai dengan panduan atau standar jurnal. Jenis font yang digunakan adalah Tahoma 9,5 pt spasi 1. Abstrak ditulis dalam bahasa Indonesia dan bahasa Inggris. Jika dalam bahasa Indonesia, maka kata atau istilah yang berasal dari bahasa Inggris atau bahasa asing yang lain ditulis dalam cetak miring (*italic*). Abstrak dituliskan dengan bahasa yang ringkas dan jelas, tidak memuat acuan daftar pustaka, dan lengkap menggambarkan esensi isi artikel secara keseluruhan.

Abstract

Abstract should describe clearly regarding the content of the article. It includes the aims of community service program, methods, findings and conclusion. It is also suggested to highlight the research problem in the first paragraphs as an introduction. Abstract is written in normal font for 150-200 words long. If it is more than 200 words, the editor will ask the authors to have revision. On the other case, the editor has right to revise abstract in order to meet the standard. The font used for abstract is Tahoma 9,5 pts, italic with 1 spacing. Abstract must be in Bahasa and English. If it is in Bahasa, the terms or words in English or other foreign languages should be italic. Abstract is written clearly and not contain ambiguous sentence, not contain references, and completely describe the essence of the contents of the article.

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INTRODUCTION

The submitted document must function as a comprehensive proposal for a community empowerment activity. The Background section requires high academic rigor, demanding a clear identification of the specific target population (community) and a detailed explanation of the context in which they take shelter or reside. Crucially, this section must establish the empirical basis for the intervention by discussing the current facts or phenomena within that population that necessitate the empowerment activities. Furthermore, to provide necessary context, authors must review and summarize the actions that have already been taken by other parties in an effort to overcome the existing problems. The overall objective is to ensure that the stated research objective and the target outcomes of the community empowerment activities are logically and explicitly related to the identified problems, challenges, or needs of the target population.

To strengthen the foundation of the proposal, authors are required to incorporate both empirical backgrounds and robust conceptual frameworks. The conceptual framework must be constructed from a review of relevant previous studies that have been published no later than five years before the submission date. A critical methodological component is the detailed explanation of participation and interaction; the document must explicitly explain the specific forms of engagement and involvement planned with the community members throughout the execution of the program.

Finally, strict formatting and submission guidelines must be adhered to. The article must be typed using Times New Roman, size 12pt, with 1.5 spacing. The overall manuscript length, including the References section (but excluding tables, figures, and appendices), must not exceed 4,500 words, and the digital file size must not exceed 7 MB (.docx or .doc format). Regarding structure, the first paragraph of every new main section must not be indented, but the first paragraph of every new subsection must be indented. All subsequent paragraphs throughout the document must be consistently indented.

METHOD

The Methodology section must fully describe the approach utilized to solve the identified problems or challenges and to successfully answer the research objectives. This description must be comprehensive and include all necessary technical details. Key components required are the specific data collection techniques employed, which must also detail the sample selection techniques used, and justification for the validity and reliability of the data collection instruments.

The section must also specify the data analysis technique that will be applied to process the collected information. Logistical details are mandatory, including the location, time, and duration of

the activities. Crucially, the authors must justify and explain the condition or situation that existed before the programs/activities were implemented (the baseline) and articulate the expected results or outcomes following the intervention.

Regarding scholarly communication, all abbreviations must be explained at their first appearance in the text and then used consistently throughout the remainder of the article. Furthermore, if the methodology refers to established or published procedures, authors are required to cite the previous method publication (e.g., Dillard, 2020 or Based on Mamur et al. (2014) the cited sentence is...). If any published method is modified for the current study, the authors must explain the details of that modification.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

The Results section must accurately present the findings of the community empowerment activities. It must be accompanied by a clear explanation of the data without referencing the literature. Authors must clearly state any original and important findings. The results should focus on the analysis of the condition before and after the programs/activities of community engagement were implemented. This analysis should be completed with a further discussion on the participation of the community as well as the impacts gained by the community. Including the adoption of innovation by the community is considered valuable additional content.

The results must be illustrated with numbers or tables if necessary, but kept to a minimum. Detailed discussion, speculation, and interpretation of the data are not included in the Results section but must be reserved for the separate Discussion section. All sub-titles in this section must be written in sentence case. For example, “4.3 The relationship between disease activity and depression and anxiety score in patients with SLE”.

Tables

All tables included in the manuscript must be cited and integrated with the analysis and/or its justification/significance concerning the community engagement programs/activities. All tables must be relevant to the study. Tables should be made in single spacing and use only horizontal lines for borders. An example format is provided:

Graphs

All graphs included in this manuscript must be cited and integrated with the analysis and/or its justification/significance concerning the community engagement programs/activities. All graphs must be relevant to the study. Graphs created with Microsoft Excel should also be submitted in their

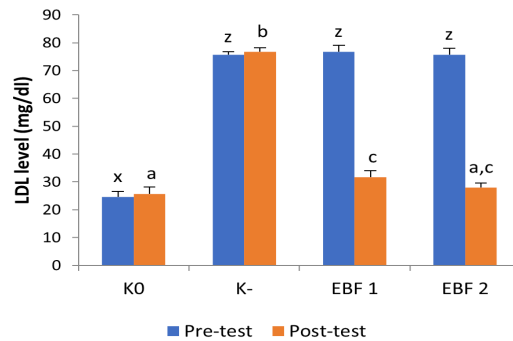


Figure 6. LDL level pre-test and post-test. Different notation shows significant differences ($p < 0.05$). KO:

original Excel file. Graphs must be presented in 2D (not 3D), without shadows or other effects, and without gridlines.

Photos and figures

All figures and photos included in this manuscript must be cited and integrated with the analysis and/or its justification/significance concerning the community engagement programs/activities. All photos and figures must be relevant to the study. If a group of photos or figures shows a process, the group is considered 1 (one) figure. Each group of figures must be prefaced with a description that links the figures. Relevant documentation must have a focus on community empowerment activities. The minimum resolution of photos and images is 300 dpi with JPEG extensions (.jpg). Authors should use image processing software to verify the dpi.

The Discussion section must interpret the findings obtained in the results section with the background of existing knowledge, ensuring that it does not simply repeat the results. The discussion must highlight what is new and original about the findings. Each assumption made must be clearly stated. It must establish linkages between the results and the context of the target population, discussing possible generalizations to other populations, and analyzing the advantages and disadvantages of the community empowerment activities carried out considering the conditions of the surrounding community.

CONCLUSION

The Conclusion section must effectively summarize the success of the project by reporting on the level of achievement of the set targets for the community empowerment activities. It must also provide a conclusive statement regarding the conformity of the community empowerment methods used with the specific problems, needs, and challenges identified within the area of intervention. Finally, the conclusion must articulate the overall impact and benefits realized from the community empowerment activities. Following the conclusion, the document must offer constructive advice (recommendations) for further or subsequent community empowerment efforts.

REFERENCES

References are written based on APA 7th edition style. References are listed in numerical order, and in the same order as quoted in the text. The References only lists references that you have quoted in the text. The author is responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the references. Consistent with reference styles throughout the article. Avoid using more than 40 and less than 10 references. Highly recommend using 70% journal references and 30% book references. Journal references should be published at least 5 recent years. Authors are strongly urged to use a reference manager such as Zotero, Endnote, RefWorks, Reference Manager, or Mendeley to build their bibliography. Here is an example reference format with the style of APA Style 7th Edition.
