2024-2025 Preschool NTI

Preschool students are responsible for completing four required activities and one activity from the choice grid for each missed day which is an NTI day. Please complete the activities below with your child. You will receive a Google form through the Meade County Schools app to complete at the end of the day to document the completed activities. This will need to be completed for your child to be counted as present.

NOTE: If the missed day falls on a Friday, preschool students are not responsible for NTI work.

REQUIRED Activities:

- 1) Read 2 books with your child
- 2) Count to 30 (3 yr olds can practice counting to 10)
- 3) Say the alphabet (3 yr olds can practice singing it)
- 4)Practice writing first name (3 yr olds can trace their name)

Art: Draw a picture about something that you did today and tell someone about it. Write down what your child tells you. (NOTE: don't worry if they can only scribble, that may be appropriate for his/her age or ability level. Any effort should be accepted as a representation of their snow day.)	Gross Motor: Play an active game (Ex. Follow the Leader, Simon Says, Hullabaloo, create an obstacle course, etc.) with your child having them do physical things like balancing on one foot for 10 seconds, do jumping jacks and walking backwards.
Handwriting: Practice printing your first and/or last name. Learning to write is a process and all students are at different levels. Check with your child's teacher to see how your child is writing his/her name.	Math: Practice counting as high as you can go verbally and with objects.
Technology: Play an educational game on your phone, computer, tablet, etc.	Literacy: Say the alphabet. Go on an alphabet hunt around your house and look for letters that you see. Kitchen food containers, magazines, books, newspapers, etc.
Science: Do an experiment! Place a bowl of snow in different places around your home (Ex. counter, refrigerator, porch, etc.) and time how long it takes it to melt. Discuss with your child why it took longer/melted quicker in each area.	Music: Freeze Dance An adult turns on upbeat music (use your phone, computer, a radio, or music stations on your TV), then the student will dance until the music is paused or muted. He/she will "freeze" in position until the
Social: Play a board game with your child. Focus on taking turns, playing fair, following the rules and good sportsmanship (don't always let them win; they learn from losing also).
