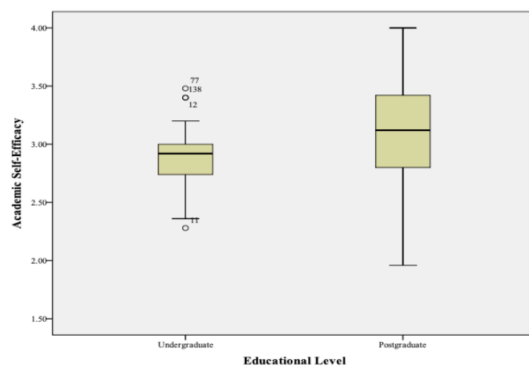


Figure 1. Boxplot Differences Academic Self-Efficacy based on Degree
