

Summary

This sermon focuses on wealth, finances, and possessions from a biblical perspective, using the game Monopoly as a metaphor. Pastor Nithin contrasts the world's rules of acquiring wealth (which lead to spiritual bankruptcy) with God's rules of generosity and eternal perspective. He emphasizes that while money itself isn't evil, the love of money (mammon) can become a spiritual force that enslaves people and prevents them from trusting God fully.

Lord, as we gather to discuss finances and stewardship, open our hearts to Your wisdom. Help us see beyond our earthly perspective to understand Your principles of generosity and trust. Guide our conversation and show each person here what You want them to learn about handling the resources You've given us. In Jesus' name Amen.

This week, take time to review your spending habits and financial priorities. Ask God to show you areas where you might be trusting in money rather than Him. Consider taking the 90-day tithing challenge as a step of faith in trusting God with your finances.
