Biographical Profile

My professional life has been largely dedicated to broadening mental health access, equity, and advocacy for children and families. Twelve years ago, I founded The Child & Family Institute as a single practitioner in NY, and today the organization has grown to include over 50 dedicated clinicians, consultants, and volunteers throughout the U.S. In addition to its broad range of specialized clinical programs and services, CFI offers comprehensive training in evidence-based assessments and treatments for aspiring psychologists and social workers, including through our training partnership with Columbia University-Teacher's College.

In early 2020, we launched our nonprofit, Weissman Children's Foundation (WCF), to reach families in greatest need. As COVID became a national crisis, Phase I of our work, our COVID Mental Health Relief Initiative, helped uninsured/underinsured communities cope, adapt and thrive during the pandemic, with a focus on underserved communities of color. Last year, we launched our Phase II Community Wellness Initiative, partnering with the Westchester County government, community organizations, and local faith leaders and police chiefs to focus our efforts and build bridges of strategic collaboration and support. Vital to this phase, we launched an Equity and Effectiveness Scientific Council, partnering with renowned clinical psychology researchers and treatment developers to study treatment effectiveness, mental health disparities, and cultural sensitivity/satisfaction toward greater health equity, de-stigmatization, and social justice. On the horizon, Phase III will feature our IMPACT (Innovating Meaningful Partnerships Across Community Therapists) Initiative, leveraging an innovative AI-based therapist-client matching software to partnering with hundreds of mission-driven therapists able to donate one therapy hour per week to our cause. Looking ahead, Phase IV will feature broad-based community and continuing education programming, creative children's literature to appeal directly to young children, and the development of a new compassion-focused psychotherapy to help parents and caregivers in need of support. To date, WCF has helped over 1000 children, young adults, and family members of all ages.

Throughout my career, I have been fortunate to work and train alongside inspiring mentors, colleagues, and students at the University of Pennsylvania, Rutgers University, NYU/Bellevue Hospital, Harvard University, Harvard Medical School, Yeshiva/Albert Einstein Hospital, Columbia University, and MIT. Currently, I am an Adjunct Professor at Columbia University and I serve as Immediate Past-President

of the Westchester County Psychological Association and the New York State Psychological Association's Cognitive Behavior Therapy (CBT) Division. Over the past three years, I have been deeply honored to receive the American Psychological Association's *Distinguished Contributions to Practice Award*, the highest practitioner honor in our field; as well as Healthcare Hero and Public Health Awards from Westchester County Executive, George Latimer and the Board of Health. I am deeply committed to the alleviation of child and human suffering through evidence-based psychotherapeutic approaches--and partnering to expand equity and access to best practices for underserved children and families nationwide.
