The Articles of Confederation

- I. Formation of the Articles of Confederation. During the war (1776-1777), the Continental Congress met to form a new government.
 - A. States are fighting a war against a strong central government– they do not want a government like England
 - B. Each state had one vote
- II.Government was weak under the Articles of Confederation
 - A. Each state kept its own freedoms
 - 1. Articles could not be changed without the consent of all
 - 2. Congress could only request money from the states; states could choose to send money
 - 3. No leader (executive) to enforce the laws of Congress
 - 4. No national court system
 - B. The United States was powerless to do many things necessary to function as a nation
- III. Great Land Ordinances of the Confederation
 - A. Articles of Confederation were approved only when the states gave up land claims in the west. They became part of public domain.

- B. Ordinances of 1785 for Northwest Territory
 - 1. area was divided up and sold by the government
 - 2. money from land sales would go to national treasury and used for public schools in that area
 - 3. government in the Territory
 - a. first ruled by Congress
 - b. when population reached 60,000 inhabitants it become a state
 - 4. only positive part of the Articles of Confederation; this system will remain even when the Articles are discarded for the U.S. Constitution
