To indicate significance, use the symbol “*” or “**” for $P < 0.05$ and $P < 0.01$, respectively, in the table and within the content of the article/manuscript. Utilize the metric system by using abbreviations such as 100%, 10 cm, 1 mg/mL, etc. If the mean and P-value are needed to be presented, the standard error of the mean (SEM) must be included.

In the Discussion part, this section may include the study’s findings, which should be supported by research comparisons with the results of others’ research. It should also address important issues or controversies in the subject matter and provide suggestions for further studies and potential applications.

The term “et al.” doesn’t need to be italicized. Use “and” when there are two authors. Use “et al.” when there are three or more authors. For example: David et al. (2008) and David and Thomas (2002)
