

## Class 1: Created & Called – God’s Story and Our Identity

### Opening Prayer

Heavenly Father, I thank You that I am not alone in this world. I was created by You, called by You, and claimed by You in Baptism. Help me to grow deeper into Your story and find my place within it. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

### Guided Discussion

- What’s a story from the Bible that has always stuck with you? Why?
- If you had to describe the Bible in 3 words, what would they be?
- How would you explain the difference between Law and Gospel to someone new?
- How do you understand your own Baptism? (If not baptized, what questions do you have?)
- What comes to mind when you hear the word “Lutheran”?

### Big Ideas

- We are part of a bigger story—God’s work of creation, redemption, and restoration. (Genesis 1:1)
- The Bible tells the unified story of God rescuing His people. (John 20:31)
- Scripture is God’s Word—alive, trustworthy, and powerful. (2 Timothy 3:16)
- God’s Law and Gospel show us our place in His story. (Ephesians 2:1–5)
- In Baptism, God gives you a new name and identity. (Galatians 3:27)
- Lutherans emphasize God’s grace—Scripture Alone, Faith Alone, Grace Alone. (Ephesians 2:8)
- Memory Phrase: *I am a character in God’s story.*

This week, read Psalm 139 and reflect on what it means that you are “fearfully and wonderfully made.” Where do you see God’s creative love in your life?

## From the Confessions

“Paraphrase: God’s Word cannot err. It is the utterance of the Almighty God.”

Summary of Large Catechism, Preface, paras. 9–20

“God does not want to deal with us in any other way than through the spoken Word and the Sacraments.”

Smalcald Articles, III.8, para. 10

“For where the Word is, there the Holy Spirit is at work.”

Large Catechism, Third Commandment, para. 92

“The Gospel brings it about that we come to God in the right way through Christ.”

Apology of the Augsburg Confession, IV.57

“God Himself is present in Baptism. It is performed by human hands, but it is truly God’s own act.”

“To be baptized in God’s name is to be baptized not by human beings but by God himself.”

“Faith is the righteousness through which we are counted righteous before God.”

“I believe that God has made me and all creatures... and still takes care of them.”

“Jesus has redeemed me... not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood.”

“I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ... but the Holy Spirit has called me.”

“This is most certainly true.”

“To be baptized is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God’s command and combined with God’s Word.”

“The Word of God is the treasure that makes Baptism what it is.”

“Baptism indicates that the old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die.”

“It is not our doing or speaking, but God’s Word and command that makes Baptism a Sacrament.”
