- Welmoed: At the UG we're struggling with the use of data under license that is used for research purposes. Under European law you're allowed to text and data mine for research, but publishers often prohibit this or you have to pay them to do this. We have two use cases, that I can share if you're interested. Are others struggling with this as well?

1. FAIR for survey data

Notes

- Participants: Olga Grunwald, Aisling, Jetze, Liz, Fieke, Eduard
- Olga introduces the data collections and the issue of connecting the variables. One survey collected in the 90's (no vocabularies yet). Needs technical expertise in the team



- Jetze tells about the SSHOC project in which DANS participates. One subtask is harmonization at variable level. Difficult to find the right level. Looking for sensible use cases. Come to agreements with main stakeholders. DANS could have a role in the challenge project.
- Eduard: is one of the challenges that the data has been collected in the past but aren't yet linked to vocabularies? Olga: that would be part of the larger project, to use vocabularies. Odissei one party to contact, also harmonizing metadata.
- Fieke mentions efforts by cohort studies to harmonize metadata, both retrospective and prospective
- Eduard:

- Liz: colectica platform?
- Eduard: do you already have an idea on how the outcomes can benefit a wider community?
- Fieke: important that the broader SSH community can benefit from the outcomes
- Jetze: the call is about coalition building; the deliverable / tool may be less important. Have a well-framed question with a buy-in from the main parties
- Olga: the survey has data from over 20 countries. Can that be funded by the TDCC SSH call?
- Jetze: international scope is important but the work should at least benefit the Dutch community
- Liz: how about legal issues? Olga: we have data access agreements. For this project we are more interested in the metadata than in the actual datasets.
- Olga: should the proposal address researchers or data stewards / managers etc. Fieke: the call is not for research questions but to enable research by addressing challenges related to data availability / reuse etc.
