

XBox Controller

Using an Xbox Controller on PC for Rebellion

Xbox controllers are the easiest to connect to Windows since they're made by Microsoft and use the **XInput standard** (what most PC games are built around). No extra software is needed.

1. Wired Connection (USB)

- Plug your Xbox controller into your PC using a **USB-C cable**.
- Windows will automatically detect it and install drivers.
- The controller should work right away in-game.

2. Wireless via Bluetooth

- Make sure your controller supports Bluetooth (Xbox Series X|S controllers do; older Xbox One models may not).
- Press and hold the **Pair button** on the controller until the Xbox button blinks.
- On Windows: go to **Settings** → **Bluetooth & Devices** → **Add Device** → **Bluetooth**, then select **Xbox Wireless Controller**.
- Once paired, it will reconnect automatically next time you power it on.

3. Wireless via Xbox Wireless Adapter

- Microsoft also sells the **Xbox Wireless Adapter for Windows**, which gives the most stable wireless connection and supports features like low-latency input and connecting multiple controllers.
- Plug in the adapter, press the pair button on both the adapter and the controller, and you're ready to go.
