# Message From the Dean

SLIM has been busy in recent months in updating our strategic plan to align with the recent change of our delivery mode, fully online asynchronous, and I'm happy to announce that the SLIM Council, which consists of SLIM faculty, staff, students, and alumni, approved the list of new goals of the updated SLIM strategic plan on November 18, 2022. The updated version is available at https://www.emporia.edu/school-library-and-information-management/about/slim-mission-vision-strat egic-plan/. SLIM faculty and staff will continue to work on objectives under each goal in during the upcoming spring semester and the final version will be presented to the SLIM Council for approval at the end of the semester. We had booths at the state library conferences in Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, and Arkansas during the last 3 months, meeting many enthusiastic and supporting alumni and great prospective students. For those conferences we could not participate in person, SLIM put sponsorships for nationwide promotion of our online programs. SLIM plans to have booths at ACRL and ALA Annual Conferences next year along with a few state conferences in spring and summer. 
