

ERHS AVID COMMUNITY SERVICE



- REQUIREMENT: A minimum of 15 hours each semester. Community Service hours are to be recorded on the Eleanor Roosevelt High School AVID Community Service LOG
- WHAT: Community Service is work done by a person or group of people that helps a specific community. The activity must be a non-paid, volunteer activity done through an APPROVED organization. You will be given a list of pre-approved organizations and activities. Any activity NOT on the list, requires teacher approval beforehand. Please note, the following activities DO NOT COUNT as community service: doing chores, babysitting, helping family and friends, volunteering at a family business, being on a sports team.
- WHY: Research shows that high school students involved in activities like community service, clubs, and extracurricular activities such as AVID, ASB, LINK Crew, Renaissance, Cheer, Unity, Band, and sports have higher GPA's and better attendance records in high school. College admission and scholarship boards know this and are looking for well-rounded students who will be successful in college too. Admissions and college boards want students with commitment and passion. It is more important to find a couple of things you love and take a leadership role in those activities than to have a low level of involvement in many things or a record of starting and quitting activities.

Big Brothers Big Sisters * https://tinyurl.com/muvj9jje	The High School Bigs program by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Inland Empire pairs high school students with elementary school students in a one-on-one mentoring relationship. High school volunteers meet weekly with their "Littles" to help with homework, engage in recreational activities, and foster personal development. This role allows teens to serve as positive role models while enhancing their leadership and advocacy skills. Volunteers must be in grades 9-11, reside in the Inland Empire, and commit to at least one year

Child Creativity Lab * https://tinyurl.com/tm6bz7zm	Volunteering at the Child Creativity Lab includes opportunities for teens to assist with STEAM-based workshops in the Makerspace-on-Wheels Outreach Program, help organize materials at the Depot for Creative Reuse, and support creative projects. Volunteers work on tasks like setting up and cleaning workshops, interacting with children, and preparing STEAM Challenge Kits. Volunteers aged 16+ can join independently, while younger participants might need supervision.

Volunteers provide non-clinical support to the staff of the hospital. Duties include, but are not limited to: escorting guest, running errands, assisting patients (non-clinical), assisting staff with special projects and serving in the Gift Shop.

Volunteering at the Environmental Nature Center (ENC) involves opportunities such as horticulture (weeding), participating in the Fall Faire, assisting in the office, and engaging in habitat restoration. Volunteers can help at the ENC in Newport Beach or at the Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary in Modjeska Canyon. The program is open to high school students and younger children (with a guardian), aiming to contribute to community service, gain new skills, and connect with nature. Volunteer opportunities for minors starting from the age of 12. However, minors must be accompanied by a parent, guardian, or chaperone for the entire duration of the volunteer shift. Volunteers can participate in a variety of activities, including sorting and packing food, assisting in food distribution, and more.

Giving 365 provides resources, support, and educational opportunities for families and individuals struggling with poverty to achieve self-sufficiency and reach their full potential. Our programs include a food pantry that provides over 25,000 pounds of food annually to the community, job readiness support, parent education, self-advocacy trainings, financial literacy classes, a summer backpack and school supply giveaway, a Thanksgiving holiday meal donation program, and a holiday gift drive providing children with toys. We are currently developing a one-on-one mentoring program for at-risk youth and youth in foster care as well as a school gardens program.
Various volunteer opportunities that are suitable for students throughout the year. These include food sorting and repacking at their Lexington Volunteer Center. Additionally, there are virtual volunteering options available, such as making cards for seniors.
Volunteers are needed on-site to help with sorting donations as they arrive. Additionally, volunteers are required daily to assist with picking up donated items from local stores and restaurants. This task involves collecting and transporting donations which are essential for the organization's daily operations
Project Volunteer (ages 16+), Homework Club Tutor/Kids Zone Program (ages 16+), Special Events (ages 16+), Survey Volunteer (ages 16+), Youth Sports Assistant Coach (ages 16+).
Musician Volunteer (Ages 14+): Volunteers with a talent for playing one or more musical instruments are welcome to share their musical gift with patients and visitors. Summer Teen Program (14-17+): Teens interested in spending part of their summer helping others can come spend six weeks with us. Volunteer duties include, but are not limited to, activities such as helping visitors at information desks, clerical assistance and creating 'Notes of Kindness' for hospital in-patients.
With more than 35 volunteer positions, we have opportunities for everyone who wants to help homeless pets. Here are just a few: Work with patrons and pets; Work with dogs, cats, kittens, and puppies in animal enrichment; Provide administrative support in many of our departments; Care for newborn puppies and kittens by being a foster parent; Provide assistance at our thrift store by sorting, pricing, and merchandising.
Here you are as important as the donations we receive. Cleaning the receiving area and fridges. You will be responsible for sorting food items and storing them in their respective places. Note: There may be some heavy lifting involved.
Volunteering with NDR Therapeutic Riding includes assisting during therapeutic riding lessons, helping at special events, maintaining facilities, and supporting horse care and maintenance. Volunteers can also donate time, funds, or horses and tack. These contributions help enhance the lives of individuals with disabilities through equine-assisted activities. Volunteers must be at least 13 years old, and community service hours can be credited.

Some duties of our Volunteers include: welcoming visitors and patients to the Hospital; escort visitors to departments throughout the Hospital; offer a comforting presence and distribute comfort items to patients; drive visitors around campus in our golf carts; support the Sick Baby & Hospital Assistance Fund by working in the Tender Touch Gift Shop.
