THINGS TO DO IN STOCKHOLM, SWEDEN

Stockholm offers a great blend of city culture and natural beauty. Here are just a few ideas of activities and places to visit. Please note: we may already be visiting some of these locations and some may have an entrance fee.

- Royal Djurgården this island in central Stockholm has several historical buildings and monuments, museums and galleries including the <u>Vasa Museum</u>, <u>Gröna Lund Amusement Park</u>, <u>Skansun</u>, the world's oldest open air museum, the Biological Museum, the <u>ABBA Museum</u>, and the <u>Nordic Museum</u>, as well as many footpaths and water front promenades.
- <u>Swedish History Museum</u>, where you will experience dramatic life stories, power struggles, love, celebration and everyday life from the ice age to the present.
- The <u>Nobel Prize Museum</u>, the museum gives the history of Nobel and his prize, and then uses donated objects from past winners to tell stories.
- The Royal Palace, is His Majesty The King's official residence and one of the country's most important buildings, and a concrete symbol of the course of Norwegian history since 1814.
- City Hall, with great views of the city.
- <u>Drottningholm Palace</u>, is a Unesco Heritage Site located on Lovön island. It is the most well-preserved royal castle built in the 1600s in Sweden.
- National Museum, Sweden's museum of art and design.
- Södermalm island with its cafes, shops and nightlife and the trendy <u>Fotografiska</u>, a contemporary photo gallery in a former industrial building by the water.
- **Kungsträdgården**, the park's central location and its outdoor cafés makes it one of the most popular hangouts and meeting places in Stockholm.
- Monteliusvägen, a footpath on steep cliffs. It offers impressive views of Stockholm.
- Yarn shops The current listed yarn shops in Stockholm include <u>Litet Nystan</u> and <u>Klara Tyg and Garn</u>, and STHLM Knit Company. Check first for closures and new listings.
