Who is eligible?

- Rising 8th graders enrolling in [Math Jump Start](#), apply [here](#)
- Students with an IEP
- English Language Learners (English Language Development, World History, US History)
- 9th, 10th, and 11th graders
- Make up Ds/Fs (Social Studies, English, Math, Science)
- Credit recovery (Social Studies, English, Math, Science)
- Accelerated Courses (Math Course 3). Apply [here](#) to the Math Course 3 accelerated program no later than
- 12th graders enrolling in Senior Courses

How do I sign up?

- School Counselors at your current school will enroll eligible 9th, 10th, and 11th graders in a recommended course by between April 11th and April 29th, 2022
- The Summer School office will email 9th, 10th, and 11th grade parents/guardians the week of May 2nd to opt-in to reserve their space in Summer School (does not include Math Jump Start)

What are the attendance requirements?

- Students will be dropped from summer school for:
 - Excused or unexcused absences totalling more than 2 days of school
 - Missing the first day of summer school
 - Missing the last day of summer school
 - Disciplinary reasons
 - Tardies are calculated as time towards school absence

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Will masks be required?



Summer school will follow guidance from our School Board of Education, updates to follow as we approach summer session. Currently, masks are strongly encouraged on all school campuses and vaccination against COVID-19 is recommended.

2. Is there an online summer school option?

JUHSD will not have an online option for summer school. Students will be required to physically attend school

3. What if my high school student is currently enrolled in Remote Independent Study and has not completed their course(s) by the last day of school (May 26th, 2022)?

Your student can be enrolled in summer school to complete the Remote Independent Study course (for students currently enrolled in Remote Independent Study, the Summer School Office is exploring additional options).

4. Will lunch be served? Will there be a charge?

Breakfast and lunch will be provided at no cost to the students.

5. How many credits can students earn?

Students can earn 5 credits (with exception of Senior Studies) and up to 10 credits for a year long course (e.g. World History, Math Course 3)

6. Where will Summer School be held?

Summer School will be held at Jefferson High School.

7. What if I want to take a different class than what my counselor has programmed me for?

Meet with your counselor prior to the end of the school year to discuss the course selection. After May 31st and beginning June 1st, 2022, questions related to summer enrollment will require an appointment with a summer school counselor. To make an appointment, please click [here](#).

8. How will I know if I have a space in a summer school course?

For 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th graders, parents/guardians will be emailed an opt-in form to confirm summer school enrollment the week of May 2nd

9. What are the attendance requirements?

Students will be dropped from summer school for:

- Excused or unexcused absences totalling more than 2 days of school
- Missing the first day of summer school
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10. If I am unable to attend the JUHSD Summer School, are there other options for summer learning?

11. We have vacation plans and will miss summer school days, are there exceptions to missing more than 2 days of summer school?

Unfortunately, no more than 2 days of absence (excused or unexcused) will be allowed.

12. How long will JUHSD continue enrolling new students to Summer School 2022?

Wednesday June 8th, 2022 will be the last day the Summer School Office will enroll new students to summer school (this includes students on any class waitlists).
