Student Led Conference Instructions Fall 2024

Thursday, October 17, 2024 is Student Led Conference Night, from 5:00-7:00 pm. Student led conferences provide students with a structured opportunity to talk with parents about their educational progress. The meetings are facilitated by the student following the model taught by English teachers. Students will spend 15-30 minutes discussing their progress in each of their courses. They will show their parents work, projects, and their Schoology app to demonstrate their learning. During the meeting, the student also shares his or her educational goals. The student analyzes his or her strengths and weaknesses, and reflects upon the educational consequences of choices made. Together, the student and parents determine what each will do to help the student move closer to the student's educational goals. Here are the steps in the process:

Prior to conference night:

- English teachers, will coach the students in leading the conferences according to the chart below. To facilitate this, the English teachers will have the students download the <u>Self-Evaluation Form</u> and complete their section. Teachers may also opt for a paper version of this form. They will practice a mock conference with their peers.
- 2. <u>Every</u> teacher should determine the work, projects and/or Schoology data they want their students to share. The choice of what to share is entirely up to you. Discuss the work/data to be shared with your classes.
- 3. Ask students to have these documents, files and links ready.

Jan. 22-26	Inform students about Student Led Conference Night 2/22/2024. Let them know it will take place in assigned rooms for their grade level.
Feb. 12-16	English teachers add the Student Led Conference Self Evaluation Form to your class assignments. Using a print version is OK too!
Feb. 12-16	English teachers will teach a lesson on SMART Goals. Here are two sources: Khan Academy and Teachervision.
Feb. 16-21	Explain to students how to hold a Student Led Conference.
Feb. 16-21	Have students take turns role playing a Student Led Conference with a peer.

On Conference Night:

- 1. Parents will get the ten week progress report from a table near the Magnet Office.
- 2. Students will take their parents to their assigned class to meet. (See page 5)
- 3. Students will conduct the conference and discuss their progress in every course, as well as the items their teachers asked them to share.
- 4. Students will complete the Student Led Conference Self Evaluation Form. (Print is OK!)
- 5. If parents feel they need clarification from teachers, they may visit them in their classrooms.
- 6. Debbie will distribute a spreadsheet of participants to staff in case you plan to award extra credit.

Preparing Students for the Student Led Conference

English teachers:

Teach these procedures to your students. Remind them to act as though they were making a professional presentation.

- 1. Explain you will be sharing your academic progress during the conference.
- 2. Show your parents your student planner and how you have been using it.
- 3. Go over the Student Led Conference Self Evaluation Form with your parents.
- 4. Present your work. For each piece share:
 - a. What the assignment was.
 - b. What knowledge or skills you learned by doing it.
 - c. What process you went through to complete the piece.
- 5. Closing Thank your parents for attending your conference.
- Upload your completed <u>Self Evaluation Form</u> to your class assignments. Or turn in the printed form to your teacher.

Student Led Conference Sample Scripts.

Suggestions:

- 1. Pick up your child's report card from the Magnet Office.
- 2. Arrive at the conference in your child's assigned room anytime between 5:00 and 6:00pm.
- 3. Focus all of your attention on the child giving the conference. Do not bring other people to your child's conference as this may distract from the process.
- 4. Make sure your child sees you "actively listening" by giving appropriate non-verbal responses (smiles, nods, etc.).
- 5. Ask your child questions of explanation. Try not to interrupt your child with too many statements.

Questions:

You might want to ask your child to:

- 1. Share with me what you feel is your greatest accomplishment this year.
- 2. What are you most proud of in your portfolio?
- 3. Where do you feel you could improve?
- 4. What can I do at home to help you improve at school?
- 5. Do you think that you have tried your hardest this year? Tell me why you feel this way.
- 6. What have you learned about yourself after doing the student-led conference?
