Online Privacy Policy for Death Doula Training

Online courses hold both benefits and responsibilities for all persons involved. Please review the following information before watching or attending ASP's online Death Doula Training.

The following policies are in place to honor individuals and groups personal and/or sensitive information that may be shared in confidence, but it can also protect people's physical safety. We trust that you will not have additional people listening and watching with us.

LIVE CLASSES are a time for community gathering and are not recorded unless previously agreed upon by everyone in the group. The subtitles and captions are auto generated and at times make mistakes. On zoom all attendees have the option to change your zoom name and/or turn the camera off in order to protect your online privacy and safety.

PLEASE DO NOT record content during classes via computer, screen recording, or another device. DO NOT screenshot or share screenshots from classes where the name of another student or their image is visible. In addition to audio and visual privacy, DO NOT share anyone's personal details or stories from class. Take the lessons not the details <3 is a helpful way of remembering this.

CONSENT TO RECORD cohort classes may occur only with permission in advance from ALL participants. We do acknowledge the potential benefits of a recorded class. For this reason, facilitators and students may occasionally be asked for their consent to record individual sessions. This may occur if a student is unable to attend class (because of illness, family emergency, etc.) to have access to class content. Recording may also be requested in advance if it will provide an opportunity for all students to review specific portions of class content at their own pace, or make the class more inclusive and accessible by accommodating students with a broad range of needs or life challenges. Class recordings are not meant to be a substitute, replacement, or a complete analog for in-class attendance and participation. However, recordings may provide access to valuable classroom content and material to which students may not otherwise have access.
