

LEARNED SOCIETIES

Learned societies are 'clubs' which support a particular academic discipline. Members can include academics, researchers, students, teachers and sometimes school students and the public. Learned societies vary in size and offer a range of levels and types of support to their members and the discipline community. For example: reduced conference fees, awards and travel grants, medals and competitions, internships and placements, membership newsletter, networking, mentoring and outreach opportunities.
