- Our culture tends to glorify youth and dishonor seniors
- If one generation was missing from our church, how much would you miss them?

Younger people benefit.

According to David Kinnaman in his book, You Lost Me: Why Young Christians are Leaving the Church and Re-Thinking the Faith, only three in ten will be sustained in their faithfulness to the church. This is no doubt a nuanced issue, but what remains clear is that children and young adults who develop relationships with those outside of their own age group are more likely to stay connected to a church body.

Connections with Community and Family—Not Money—Most Important for Seniors' Quality of Life

Relationships with friends and family outweigh financial concerns among older Americans seeking fulfillment in their senior years, according to the second annual United States of Aging Survey. When asked what is most important to maintaining a high quality of life in their senior years, staying connected to friends and family was the top choice of 4 in 10 seniors, ahead of having financial means (30 percent).

She pulled my husband close and said, "Pastor, I don't like some of those new songs we sing in church, but the young people like them, so keep singing them because we need those young people." What great perspective from someone who recognized the importance of intergenerational relationships within the body of Christ.

Ruth Horst - purposeful conversations with younger generation
