AMES, IA. — A memorial service for Paul Adolph Dahm of Ames will be at 2 p.m. Saturday at Collegiate



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Presbyterian Church, of which he was a member. Private burial of the cremains will be in ISU Cemetery. Mr. Dahm, 72, died of cancer Thursday at Northcrest Health Care Center.

Born in Minneapolis, Mr. Dahm moved to Ames in 1953 and worked at Iowa State University, where he had been chairman of the Department of Zoology and Entomology and later was the first chairman of the Entomology Department after its formation. He retired in 1987. In addition, he had been a Navy veteran of World War II and was a member of several professional organizations.

Among survivors are his wife, Elizabeth "Betty"; two sons, Charles of Winchester, Mass., Paul of College Station, Texas; two daughters, Patricia Flores of San Antonio, Texas, and Margaret Stevenson of Perris, Calif.; a sister, Jean Gehrt of Racine, Wis.; and eight grandchildren.

Dr. Paul Dahm has chair at university

Dr. Paul Dahm, son of Julius H. Dahm, 614 Monroe St., has been named chairman of the department of zoology and entomology at Iowa State University, Ames, Ia.

Dr. Dahm, born in Minneapolis, was brought to Oshkosh in 1927, graduated in 1935 from Oshkosh High School, and attended Oshkosh Teachers College for two years before going on to the University of Illinois to receive his bachelor, master and doctoral degrees. He is a Charles Curtiss Distinguished Professor in agriculture at ISU and will serve as department chairman until July 1, 1978.

Lt. (JG) Paul A. Dahm, formerly of 92 Powers avenue, now of Heyworth, Ill., was a hospital corps specialist and received the Asiatic-Pacific theater service ribbon with one star, American theater service ribbon, victory medal. He entered service July 17, 1943.



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
