Draft local candidate survey

1. What's your vision for Shelbyville? How will the lives of Kentuckians be improved as a result of your time in office?
2. Large and hyperscale data centers have been moving into Kentucky to lay the groundwork for more AI use, but these centers take a massive amount of electricity and resources without employing very many people. What is your stance on large data centers that might want to move into our town?
3. What work do you think we have to do in Shelbyville to address racial inequities inside and outside the halls of government? How do we address racial injustice in our communities and schools?
4. Here in Shelbyville, immigrants are our neighbors, our friends, our co-workers, and our families. They work with us, go to church with us, we share our cultures, and build communities together. Anti-immigrant hate groups and abductions led by ICE are threatening our immigrant neighbors. What is your stance on this?
5. Here in our community, some people are organizing against LGBTQ communities - to steal books from the library that include LGBTQ characters and to close businesses that are friendly to LGBTQ patrons. What steps will you take to protect LGBTQ people from discrimination?
6. We have a shortage of "third spaces" in our community - places where people can go other than home, school, or work to spend time for free. How would you help support our parks, library, or other third spaces?
7. Shelbyville is facing rising home prices and rents that are increasingly out of reach for many residents. How can we get safe and affordable housing without creating sprawl in our community?

Flood recovery update from EKY

- The needs of flood displaced households and families continue to be high and significantly unmet by state and federal agencies. In 2022 KFTC distributed more than \$350K in direct relief to flood affected individuals and allies.
- The region needs state and federal governments to allocate hundreds of millions for new safe, affordable housing and housing rehab. KFTC has signed onto a campaign being organized by the Housing and Homelessness Coalition of Kentucky that calls for the state legislature to establish and fund an Affordable Housing Trust Fund for Disaster Response. So far no bill has been filed and there is no commitment from GOP leadership to do so.
- Beverly May has been working with Feeding East Kentucky to organize weekly grocery deliveries to people displaced by the flood at several state parks and campgrounds. Some other Big Sandy chapter members have volunteered to do some of these runs along with other folks in the area.
