

- Brandon has shared this year's Satisfaction Survey out, with a deadline of January 3 for responses. The structure will be the same as last year, where individual CSU library staff and faculty will have the opportunity to share their personal feelings on Alma and Primo VE as well as the ULMS committees. This survey has been an important and useful way to share our perception of how well Ex Libris and their systems are working for us as a vendor and product. Primo VE will be a particular focus this time around due to our recent implementation.
 - COLD should receive a summary survey report in late Jan
- Ex Libris moved to a new Salesforce portal in early November. It was a bumpy transition and some functionality was lost - staff visibility into cases opened by other CSUs being a big one. Ex Libris has been working to resolve issues stemming from the migration.
- Rapido Implementation mode testing at Fullerton, Humboldt, and Los Angeles.
 - Began biweekly meetings with Ex Libris Rapido developers.
 - Developing CSU specific configuration recommendations and guides.
- Working with Discovery to determine scope and reach of Dedup/FRBR issues (actually likely related to UResolver working with existing data to form ViewIt portions for records) with the goal of making ExL more aware of our pain in this area. The results will likely be communicated first through the Satisfaction Survey.
- We will be testing some new "Out of the Box" Analytics reports for consortia on overlap analysis. These new reports are currently focusing on electronic resources with an eye toward aiding retention/subscription decisions.
- The Resource Management committee is polling staff regarding policy needs with cataloging free online/e-resources. This poll was launched the week of November 22 with the CSU Cataloging Contacts. Policy recommendations will be made to the Steering Committee in the spring and shared with COLD if accepted.
- With COLD's approval of the UC/CSU reciprocal agreements, the Resource Sharing committee is continuing to move forward with strengthening the resource sharing partnership between both systems.
- The Fulfillment committee sent out a Leganto Survey to Access Services listserv to gather feedback about which CSUs have Leganto, how they are using it, and what campuses are interested in learning about Leganto. We are hoping to get a volunteer to demo their version of Leganto for an Fulfillment Open Forum.
- ScholarWorks records have been imported into Primo VE and are now available in search results.

- Primo/Primo VE Search Scope Research Findings undertaken by Gabriel Gardner (CSULB) and Heather Cribbs (SLO) will be shared with the Discovery community at this Friday's Open Forum (12/10).
