Sounds Like a Book: NOMAD is a mobile extension of the residency program *Sounds Like a Book*. Pursuing the drive to activate the archive, it explores new formats of presenting and interacting with the artistic books and the sound compositions created over the years outside the traditional art spaces. The books and sonic compositions will follow a pre-established route, stopping along the way to our friends and collaborators across Europe who will create intimate, interactive and performative settings for engagement.

The program will offer alternative ways of hearing and experiencing the books and sounds during the following editions:

Context Sounds Like a Book Residency Program

Sounds like a Book is a book-making and self-publishing platform that addresses those interested in the book as a medium of artistic expression. As the chosen name suggests, SLB focuses on the visual transmission, conversion, and representation of the sound.

10 artists gathered at the Blue House in Şona village, Braşov county to develop an artistic project employing two rarely connected mediums of expression – sound and book. The working process involved conceiving an artist's book starting from a mental image or from sounds produced/recorded during the residency program. Hijacking the senses' routine, the moments planned for field-recording / the recording became the main element in shaping the content and form of the book. The residencies incorporated two workshops and a series of lectures held by artists working in sound art and graphic design.

During the two workshops of sound art and graphic design, held by Lukas Jakob Löcker and the Graphomat team (Andreea Popescu, Andra Pavel, Mihai Popescu), the artists developed the content and shape of the books, exploring the various aspects of each residency's theme.

Theme: The main interest, however, was the social aspect of communication, the immanent communality of any communication process, the (signal) transmission in the sense of a connection between entities, leaving in the background the content specific to information (a sensitive subject in the post-fact era), the sender-receiver dynamics, the medium's features and their impact. Lukas Jakob Löcker also encouraged the artists to pursue other approaches, such as: social media, obsolete mediums of communication, signal transmission, words / signs, sign / language, error, remix.

Vlad Bräteanu (RO/DE)

book name: speech to text guided meditation to the sea island

audio-work name: speech to the sea text to the island-guided meditation

The works are part of my exploration into hypnotic practices and voice as a medium. In the sound piece human speech and machine learning tasks merge and guide the listener through a juxtaposition of voices, deconstructed words alternatives and confidences by speech processing. The book comprises the first task of speech processing, the transformation of speech into text. The works combine, remake and alter two sound works: "unsettling- a guided meditation to the Sea" a collaboration between Lisa Nyberg and Julia Giertz and "island ark meditation induction" by Marcos Lutyens together with their machine learning processes and their transformation from speech to text and text into speech.

Bio

Vlad Brăteanu, born in Bacău, in the former Socialist Republic of Romania (RSR) in 1986, currently lives and works in Berlin, Germany.

Vlad Brăteanu holds a M.A. in Photography and Moving Image and a B.A. in Graphics from the National University of Arts in Bucharest. In 2016 he studied Philosophy in the Context of Contemporary Art at the Royal Institute of Art in Stockholm.

His background in graphics forms the base for theoretical and conceptual considerations in which photography functions as a primary medium. Sound/hypnotic inductions, found objects, and public interventions that use playful semiotics of imagery are found in his current practice. Navigating the boundaries between public and private spaces, and finding signifiers for (in)visibility are translated into works that raise questions on precarity, fragility and stability in neoliberal societies. Research into the concept of plasticity and the effects of language are central in his artistic practice.

Vlad is the co-founder of Template, an artist initiative and exhibition project that started in Bucharest in 2018 and is an alumnus of WHW Akademija in Zagreb in 2020.

Lera Kelemen's installation practice reflects on notions of femininity, confinement, body structure, vulnerability & equilibrium. Analysing the limitations of bodies in space, she uses her own body to model and enliven matter. Her works result in conceptually immersive settings where shapes, surfaces and armatures blend together to define new entities.

My work also engages the viewer through the different textures and weight of the paper. The interaction of each spectator allows the production of a new personal sound and image.

Bio

Simona is an artist born in Bucharest, Romania. The artist adopts the role of an "observer," aiming to analyze events without attempting to guide their course or impose a predefined path on the viewer. Her research explores the delicate boundary between narrative and non-narrative. Finishing a th PhD thesis at UNArte – the National University of Arts in Bucharest – she began her artistic journey in Paris, where her introduction to the French art scene began in 2013 during her Erasmus exchange at ESAD Grenoble-Valence University. There, she immersed herself in professional studios and developed her own installations.

Theme: As a starting point, *BUZZZZ* questioned the aggressive intervention of man in nature throughout the last centuries, an intervention that generated a significant ecological and climatic imbalance.

BUZZZZ interrogated the asymmetric relationship between human and non-human agents, which led to the destruction of the ecosystem and biodiversity, simultaneously proposing a search for alternative ways of coexistence, based on care and interrelation. Through extended and immersive detours, the artists in residency explored alternative sonic landscapes and ways of transpersonal, transversal and affective connection to the environment.

Anca Tintea (RO)

15 seconds

This publication explores the perception of time in a variety of landscapes, affected to different degrees by human intervention.

The sonic environment that develops from this interference with the natural world, such as architecture, from incipient to industrialized, directly affects the perception of time.

The numbers serve as a guide for the passage of 15 seconds and their respective rhythm in each setting.

Delia Andrada Prodan (RO)

Title Book: Familiar trees
Title of the Audio piece: Wind

The sound piece and the book developed at this year's residency represent a personal approach in regards to the subject of *Anthropocene*.

For Wind, sounds are intertwined in order to create a meditative frame. Most of them are not of their apparent origin (not simply recorded), but created with the voice or the body and manipulated through editing. The breathing mixes with what supposedly is the sound of the wind, constructing two different layers, between which other sounds alternate.

The book, Familiar trees recontextualize illustrations of scientific origin, selected from 1906's homonymous work. By associating photomicrographs and drawings with own photographs, ones selected from a personal, affective archive, the meanings transform and settle at the boundary between two fields: encyclopedic and artistic. The formal choices, notably the practical size of the work, wish to remind of a pocket notebook, used in research; while also evoking the appearance of a classical photography book design.

Bio

Delia A. Prodan focuses her practice around ordinary objects and raw materials, captured in their moments of fragility. From pieces of marble and concrete to metal and brick, the way she works reveals a nostalgic and empathetic perspective. For her, objects are alive: they bruise, crack, and tell stories. Interested in both photography and (recently) sculpture, she often utilizes text and books, analogies, and fractured narratives.

Listen to the Shadows (dialogue) - sound piece Listen to the Shadows - book

Concept Sound: "Listen to the Shadows (dialogue)", is an experimental sound piece based on the mix of two different sources. On one hand, the recording of the sound of a shadow with a contact microphone that –mysteriously– reveals a deep, regular low-frequency beat. On the other hand, the recording of a live improvisation session with a midi controller shows an intuitive and eclectic flux of sounds.

The mix of these two layers could be considered as a conversation between my shadow and me. A dialogue that can happen without words, in the middle of an erratic promenade that -maybe- leads to silence.

Concept Book: "Listen to the Shadows" is an experimental handmade art book gathering a selection of visual material created with the principle of transduction. An erratic promenade where one is invited to experience not only the sound of a shadow, but also the scan and print of a video and even the image of a sound.

Carlos Bernal Barrera was born in 1985 in Bogota, Colombia. He has lived in Rennes, France since 2013. He studied at the University of Rennes 2 where he wrote his thesis *L'attente comme conduite* under the direction of John Cornu for his Master's degree in Plastic and Poetic Arts in 2015. His artistic practice takes shape through drawing, video and sound. The artist questions modern certainties, the perception of time and gives an important place to chance. Theme: The residency proposed an in-depth exploration of myths as an in-between reality and fiction type of story. It employed the power of imagination to ascribe meaning and the individual memory to recall the layers of significance. The thread between active and inactive spaces, between places and landscapes, between here and elsewhere lies in the capacity of myths to build a frame in order to accommodate the out-of-the-ordinary and the eerie inside the community. The residency was based on the process of exploring the sonic and material landscapes that lie at the core of the local myths in Sona.

Guillaume Bihan

At Night I Sang to Bears

The book and the sound piece are two parts of the same work. Although they exist independently, they explore the pictorial dimension and the repetitive aspects of images and sounds, like rhythms that complement each other. Be it visual or auditory, the emphasis is on the almost sensual contemplation of a landscape, on a journey between nature and humanity.

Everything is tinted by a feverish melancholy and a disturbing peacefulness. Followed by the images of an armchair where a *Doina* is sung, and a skull with its teeth pulled out, the two pieces have a personal story threaded throughout, a lingering presence of a sweet heaviness.

Guillaume Bihan, born in 1997, is a French-born visual artist, also a graphic designer and a curator, working and living in Paris.

Currently in his final year of a Photo/Video master's at l'École des Arts Décoratifs de Paris, Guillaume Bihan's work is a fusion of visual and textual narration. His practice unfolds in photos, videos, cinema, installation and writing, driven by the fictionalization of personal experiences. Echoes, Spells and Disenchantment

Memory is a subjective recollection of the past, each time used, information being modified. An echo is a distortion of a sound that travels and bounces off surfaces, but can it be seen as a blurry image of the past?

The two-part project, sound piece and publication, began by speculating on the linearity and circularity of time, how it affects places, and how memory works.

Small villages like Şona, from Braşov county, Romania, are places where time seems to flow more slowly. Villagers live their lives according to a solar rhythm, to the length of the day, to nature and its seasons. Their rare extraordinary happenings are remembered through stories passed on orally. By researching the local myths, legends, and conspiracy theories, the collection came out rather fragmentary, blurred by the locals' more present-day, recent history and media-affected interest.

To clarify the vague and overlapping view, I've used text-to-image Artificial Intelligence as a consulting of a collective memory, trained on billions of images. The more probable the information, the better the results. Like in a game of hot and cold, I feed the AI with the fragments and images taken in Sona, going through art history as the scenes dictated, modifying the description after each result, and getting slowly to the bigger picture.

These filtered-out echoes are singing a legend beyond the known past, about destiny, the passage of time, the circularity of history, and human nature, bringing me back to the intent of my research.

If the sound piece is a boat trip that ends where it starts and vice versa, hearing along distant bits and parts of more clear and more distorted information, the book focuses on these details, filtering and recomposing them.

Bio

Alexandru Mihai Budeș is primarily a storyteller. Touching biographical elements, he weaves together: fact, history, mythology, observations and parallels drawn between the cultures encountered, elements of literature and conversations, human feelings, and states of mind - which interrogate different aspects of common and personal reality, consciousness, and subconsciousness.

His diverse background forms the blueprint of his artistic practice that connects, translates and operates across the borders of different media, artistic genres and disciplines. The work takes the shape of sculptures, performances, films, drawings, installations, machines, and Al programs, which he creates by drawing on sources ranging from local legends to global knowledge and personal anthropology
