

Doctoral colloquium paper template (paper title)

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Abstract. 8 mm of space bellow list line of affiliation and 10 mm above the abstract. The heading Abstract in Arial bold 9-point. The body in normal 9-point Times in a single paragraph, immediately following the heading. The text in 1 line spacing. The abstract should be centred across the page, 17 mm from the left and right page margins and justified. It should not exceed 250 words.

1 Page layout (this is Section title)

Use 170 x 250 mm paper size (W x H mm) and adjust the margins to the following (mm): Top 24, Bottom 16, Left 20, Right 20. The final printed area will be adjusted. Do not add any page numbers.

1.1 Title, authors and affiliations (this is subsection title)

1.1.1 Title (*this is subsubsection title*)

Bold Arial 16-point, justified. The first letter capitalised, rest in lower case. 22 mm of space above the title and 6 mm after the title.

1.1.2 Author names and author affiliations

First Names and Last Name, typed in 10-point Times, with a comma after all except the last author. Last author is added by “and”. Do not use academic titles.

Affiliations should be typed in 9-point Times. They should be preceded by a numerical superscript corresponding to the same superscript after the name of the author concerned. Please ensure that affiliations are as full and complete as possible and include the country.

1.2 The text

The text of your paper should be formatted as follows:

- 10-point Times, Times Roman or Times New Roman.

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- The text should be set to single line spacing.
- Paragraphs should be justified.
- The first paragraph after a section or subsection should not be indented; subsequent paragraphs should be indented by 5 mm.

Dividing the paper into sections, subsections and subsubsections should be toward following formatting: Section, 12-point **Arial bold**, 6 mm before, 3 mm after, by numbering 1, 2, 3, etc., subsection, 10-point **Arial bold**, 6 mm before, 3 mm after, by numbering 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, etc., subsubsection, 10-point *Arial Italic*, 6 mm, 3 mm after, by numbering 1.1.1, 1.1.2, 1.1.3, etc.

2 Figures and tables

Figures and tables should be of good quality, clear to read, as originals of good quality without line borders. The size of the text in figures should be approximately the same as main text (10 point, +-1point). Try to ensure that lines in picture are no thinner than 0.25 point. Try to center Figures and Tables. If you have more than one picture in row

2.1 Captions/numbering

Captions should be typed in 9-point Times. They should be centred above the tables and flush left.

2.2 Positioning

Place the figure and table as close as possible after the point where it is first referenced in the text. The reference to figure and table should be like, “As it is shown in Fig. 1” or “As it is shown in Table 2”. You can put more figures or tables in-line. In this case you should store them in cells of the table (which is centered) with invisible borders.

2.3 Colour illustrations

You are free to use colour illustrations for the online version of the proceedings but any print version will be printed in black and white and you should to take care about contrast.

3 Equations and mathematics

Equations should be centred and should be numbered with the number on the right-hand side.

$$I_s(k,i) = P_g(t,p) \quad (1)$$

$$I_s(k,i) = P_g(t,p) S_z(z \rightarrow -\beta, l) = 0 \quad (2)$$

Use italics for variables (*u*) and bold (**u**) for vectors. The order for brackets should be {[()]} , except where brackets have special significance.

The acknowledgements should be typed in 9-point Times, without title.

Acknowledgements

The acknowledgements should be typed as a text under non-numerated section.

Use IEEE Referencing Style. References should be cited in the text by placing sequential numbers in brackets (for example, [1], [2, 5, 7], [8-10]), "... as shown by Brown

[4], as previously stated.", "The theory was first put forward in 1987 [1].", "For example, see [7].", "Several recent studies [3, 4, 15, 16] have suggested that...". The references should be numbered in the order in which they are cited.
