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| <p>How did the information in the SimSchool Observation report help you better understand your students, the class, or school context?</p> | <p>What I found from this assignment, in conjunction with the “focus student” assignment, is getting to know each student can be a very deep “rabbit’s hole” to climb into. For the collaboration assignment, we used Simschool students to do our planning and assessments, but throughout I kept envisioning students in my classes. The associations didn’t necessarily remind me of one particular student, but highlighted characteristics of many different students, an element here or an element there. When I combined the before mentioned two assignments in terms of self-evaluation, I found myself assessing my own knowledge of each student, what did I really know? I am faced with the task of getting to know over 200 students that I teach every day, what can I do understand them better? I want to create a mental picture of what the students are as unique individuals in color, not black and white. I am not sure if this was the intended outcome of the work, but I know that I must find strategies that work for me to create a higher level of understanding of each student. I think that I can address this through better preparation habits by which I examine more information I have available to me. 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| <p>What do you want to know more about (in SimSchool, your role as a gen. ed. Teacher, or your role as a Special Ed. Teacher)?</p> | <p>I think I could improve my classes by providing more effective accommodations for students with 504. I read the 504 plans provided by the school, and I follow the recommendations but I would like those students to get the sense that we are doing more than bare minimum in providing accommodations. For example, a student needs space to for extended time on a test or assignment. Currently, I let students use my office of an attached storage area off my classroom and neither are “nice”, they are just a “space”. Next year my goal is to improve this situation for the students. This summer I will research some cost -effective ways to improve the area I have for extended time, independent study, or make up work.</p> |
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
