III. Child Abuse Prevention Intervention and Treatment (CAPIT) State Grant Funds

CAPC has received a request from DSES Finance to submit a preliminary budget for CAPIT expenditures for the FY 2008-2009. A separate handout will be presented to the CAPC containing the Annual Report for the previous year. Once approved by the Office of Child Abuse Prevention (OCAP), funds for the upcoming fiscal year will be approved and released.

Our CAPIT budget is \$132,208. The recommended budget for Fiscal 2007-2008 is:

- **CAPC Community Based Trainings \$ 32,000**

These funds will allow CAPC to contract with two community based independent trainers who will provide child abuse and neglect prevention trainings to the monolingual Spanish speaking community. Each trainer will be hired to provide 100 trainings in both English and Spanish to parents and teachers throughout Monterey County. The issues discussed during these trainings are child abuse and neglect prevention, domestic violence prevention, pre-natal care and additional primary prevention issues affecting children.

- **Parents-as-Teachers \$ 40,000**

It has been suggested that a reduction in funding to the Parents-as-Teachers program would impact the number of at-risk families served. So I have restored \$5000 to their budget bringing to total to the identical level of service provided last year.

- **In Home Services \$ 40,000**

These services are provided by Alisal Healthy Start for at risk families in the 93905-93906 zip codes received services through the Alisal Healthy Start program. \$5000 has also been restored to this program to maintain services at the current level.

- **Education of Professionals \$ 10,208**

These funds will be utilized as a collaborative tool to bring professional trainings on critical abuse and neglect issues to Monterey County. They will also be utilized to provide capacity building scholarships for professionals who work with children in the county.

- **CAPC Directed Allocations \$ 10,000**

These funds will be utilized to support events, conferences, programs and health fairs to assist parents of children who live in Monterey County. (Examples of these programs are the Labor of Love, Salinas Adult School Parent University, Cabrillo

Parent University, South County Collaborative Programs, and etcetera.)

Total

\$ 132,208

These recommended expenditures are at the will of the Council and can be altered upon a motion approved by the CAPC majority. **A motion is required to approve and authorize the Director to submit the preliminary CAPIT budget to DSES Finance.**

- VII. Child Forensic Interview Training:** CAPC has received information from FCS Program Manager Margaret Huffman, Susan Gleason (the Child Advocacy Clinic Social Worker) and Dr. Val Barnes asking us to address an unmet need to train social workers and law enforcement personnel in the skill of child forensic interviewing. I have contacted Rebecca Bevan at the CIHS (California Institute for Human Services) who provides a three day training on this topic throughout California. Attendees for this training will be limited to Monterey County individuals who are engaged as social work professionals, health care professionals and law enforcement personnel. This training is limited to 32 individuals and we can produce it here in Monterey for \$10,000. The training will tentatively take place at CSUMB where Susan Gleason has secured a free training facility. DSES Finance has give CAPC preliminary approval to utilize CAPIT funds to pay for this training. There are currently sufficient CAPIT funds to cover this expense without impacting ongoing programs. **A motion will be required to authorize this training.**

It is moved that the CAPC Director is authorized to contract with the California Institute of Human Services for the Child Forensic Interview Training (CFIT) to take place in the Spring. The cost of this training is not to exceed \$10,000. CAPIT funds will be utilized for this training.
