Monday June 3 - Friday June 13 *no meeting on Monday 6/2

We will host one 9-day session of the PBL Institute in-person, and participants will be paid for a total of 41 hours. Participants will meet from 8am-2pm, with a one hour lunch break from 11am-12pm. On Fridays we will meet from 8am-11pm.



Why Attend?

- To develop an interdisciplinary project from start to finish or refine/polish an existing project using best practices in PBL design. (Note: This work will be differentiated for teams with lots of PBL experience and for those just getting started)
- To participate in an "Industry Exploration" that connects PBL to authentic clients/partners.
- To connect and collaborate with teachers from across the district to continue building and sustaining our PBL Professional Learning Network.
- To receive priority district support with project-based learning during the school year.

- Design project deliverables that will be published and shared on a public platform.
- Implement your project during the 2025-2026 school year.
- Check-ins with the CCTE Program Specialist &/or the Community Schools Resource Teachers that align with project benchmarks and student or community data during the school year.
- Exhibit with a team of students at the <u>CCTE Innovation Showcase</u> in May 2026
