Training for Math Coaches

- AR Math QuEST is growing in our region. To support this growth, we will be offering QuEST Year 1: Introduction to Ambitious Teaching and QuEST Year 2: Going Deeper with Ambitious Teaching to instructional coaches and other math leaders so that they can then provide support to their teachers.
- AR Math QuEST Year 1: Introduction to Ambitious Teaching
 - AR Math QuEST (Quantitative Essentials for Students and Teachers) is a journey for ambitious teaching that promotes equity and engagement of all students in meaningful mathematics learning experiences of reasoning and problem solving. AR Math QuEST is a state-initiated professional development opportunity for exemplary teaching and learning based on NCTM's Effective Mathematics Teaching Practices and the Standards for Mathematical Practice. Participants will receive the book Taking Action: Implementing Effective Mathematics Teaching Practices for grade band K-5, 6-8, or 9-12.



- 2. Develop goals based on *Tiered Fidelity Inventory* and *receive coaching* from Behavior Support Specialists
- 3. Participate in professional learning opportunities
