WHAT IT IS

Some of you have been asking for a starting point to share your story on social media, and we're so happy to provide a first draft for you to build from. Think of this as a helpful template—it's here if you need it, but feel free to make it your own. After all, no one can tell your story better than you! THE BASIC STRUCTURE

Record a 1-2 minute video (it can be on your phone!) answering these questions:

- Who are you?
- What is your business?
- What communities do you serve?
- What are you doing right now?
- What do you need help with?

SIMPLE SCRIPT OPTION
