## Proposed Federal Loan Policy Changes Threaten the Nursing Workforce

### ISSUE SUMMARY

Recent federal policy proposals would remove nursing from the list of professional degree programs eligible for key financial aid and loan options. This change would reduce access to nursing education and undermine workforce development at a time of critical national shortage.

---

### WHY THIS MATTERS

- 1. Nursing is a professional discipline:** Nurses complete extensive scientific, clinical, leadership, and ethical training. This designation reflects the complexity and responsibility of the profession.
  - 2. Removing professional status limits financial aid:** Students, especially first-generation, rural, veteran, and Black/Brown learners, would face increased barriers to entry.
  - 3. Workforce shortages will worsen:** Texas and the U.S. are already facing record deficits in bedside nurses, faculty, and advanced practice nurses. Restricting educational access will directly harm patient safety and community health.
  - 4. This contradicts federal and state workforce priorities:** The proposal undermines HRSA, Title VIII, VA, and Texas-based strategies aimed at strengthening nursing education and training capacity.

I am writing on behalf of the Texas Nurses Association District 7 and the thousands of nurses, students, educators, and community stakeholders we serve across Central Texas to express deep concern and strong opposition to the recently proposed federal loan policy changes that would exclude nursing from professional degree classification. This proposal is not merely a technical adjustment—it is a direct threat to the strength, stability, and future growth of the U.S. nursing workforce.

Nursing is, and has long been, a rigorous professional discipline requiring extensive scientific knowledge, clinical judgment, leadership acumen, and ethical accountability. The classification of nursing as a professional degree is not symbolic; it reflects the educational preparation, clinical competencies, and societal responsibilities required for safe and effective patient care. Removing nursing from this designation is both inaccurate and profoundly harmful.

At a time when Texas and the nation face historic nursing shortages—projected to worsen significantly by 2030—this policy would actively widen the gaps in access, affordability, and opportunity for aspiring nurses. It would disproportionately impact first-generation students, rural communities, veterans, and Black and Brown students who already navigate structural barriers in higher education and healthcare career pathways.

Additionally, eliminating nursing from professional degree classification undermines ongoing state and national efforts to expand the workforce pipeline, strengthen advanced practice roles, and support nursing faculty development. With Texas already facing a critical educator shortage and limited clinical placement capacity, adding financial disincentives for nursing students threatens to derail the very workforce solutions our communities depend on.

This proposal also contradicts decades of evidence, federal workforce strategy, and bipartisan policy initiatives aimed at supporting nursing education. It stands in direct opposition to national health security priorities, emergency preparedness needs, and the federal government's own investments in nursing workforce development through HRSA, Title VIII, and VA nursing programs.

For these reasons, I respectfully urge you to:

1. **Publicly oppose the proposed federal loan policy changes.**
2. **Advocate for the continued classification of nursing as a professional degree,** ensuring equitable access to financial aid and loan programs.
3. **Support federal and state legislation that protects and expands pathways into nursing,** including funding for nursing education, faculty development, and clinical training capacity.
4. **Engage with nursing organizations, educators, and workforce leaders** to ensure that policy decisions reflect the realities and needs of the profession.

The consequences of this proposal extend beyond nursing—they directly affect the safety, health, and resilience of every community in Texas. Nurses are the backbone of our healthcare system, and policies that diminish their educational standing or obstruct their entry into the profession place that system at risk.

I urge you to stand with the nursing community and reject this harmful policy change. We welcome the opportunity to speak with you or your staff, provide testimony, or assist in building bipartisan support to protect the nursing workforce and the patients we serve.
