Principal's Message

Greetings Preschool Families,

I hope you all had a lovely April break and were able to choose adventures, rest or a combination of both!

Yesterday, our classroom teachers and speech pathologists spent time with an NPS literacy specialist as part of our ongoing effort to vertically align literacy instruction and practice with the instruction and practice that happens in kindergarten. As you know, preschool age children develop so much language through their play experiences with their special grown-ups (you!) and other children. As they are developing the vocabulary, they are also developing their sense of sound production. That sense of sound production leads to letter recognition and ultimately reading and writing. Our presenter yesterday emphasized the importance of practice and repetition at the sound production level. This is a good reminder since so many of us were taught to look at a letter and then make the sound. Science of reading research indicates it should be just the opposite, especially in these early years. Have fun emphasizing the letter sounds you hear from and make with your preschooler!

Next week is National Teacher Appreciation Week. Natick Preschool is chock-full of experienced and talented teachers, therapists, paraprofessionals and behavior specialists. Join us in acknowledging their efforts next week by showing your school spirit and sharing kind words.
