Video Opening Scene

The sign says “Deaf Art Gallery: “Art, That!””. Bonnie Sandy, the Deaf Art Coordinator, appears standing in front of the dark brown wood Armoire cabinet, the corner of the window at the left side.

Description of her appearance

Bonnie Sandy is the woman, straight, white with fair skin. Her short hair is brown with little gray hair on the sides. She wears the black polo shirt with embroidered Ohio ASLTA logo on the left side of the polo shirt. She wears a mixed leather braid and beads of bracelets on her left wrist and has purple nail polished fingernails.

Video Transcript

Bonnie begins the Daf Art Gallery that has a theme “Ar, That!”. She elaborates on the theme. It reflects your identity, experience, personality, talent... all combined, splashed on surface - “Art, That!”

Sliding to next Video Opening Scene

The still sign says “Artwork Delivery Options”. Bonnie Sandy, the Deaf Art Coordinator, appears sitting on the wood bench by the art display wall in the Art Gallery hall at the Hilton Columbus Downtown. At the left side of her is huge windows facing the street.

Description of her appearance

Bonnie Sandy is the woman, straight, white with fair skin. Her short hair is brown with little gray hair on the sides. She wears the black polo shirt with embroidered Ohio ASLTA logo on the left side of the polo shirt. She wears multi-bean bracelets on her left wrist and has deep red nail polished fingernails.

Video Transcript

Starts saying that the postage cost increases and she is grunting and goes grrr! She highly recommends that artworks are to be shipped to her mailbox at the USPS and artworks are to be packed well with plenty of bubble wraps and/or “popcorn” balls in the sturdy box/es. If the budget is not permitting for shipping, the hand-delivery can be arranged. Bonnie lives in Columbus, in the middle of Ohio. Any Artist or friend can stop by at her house and drop off the artworks on her/his way thru Ohio. The Artist or friend is welcome to spend an overnight at her house. If any artist or friend is traveling through other cities in Ohio like Cleveland, Toledo, Dayton or Cincinnati, Bonnie and the artist or friend can meet halfway to pass the artworks to Bonnie.
