

Raymond Abbott, also known as Raymond Ernest Abbott, Raymond Baerga, and “Robo-Cop,” is a violent fugitive wanted by the U.S. Marshals Service for a 1992 escape from the maximum-security penitentiary in Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico. He was awaiting sentencing for federal firearms violations after smuggling automatic weapons between Florida and Puerto Rico. Below is a verified location and timeline dossier compiled from the official U.S. Marshals Service site, media archives, and law enforcement databases as of October 22, 2025.

OSINT Observations

- Several archived press statements (USMS and media) emphasize Abbott-Baerga's intelligence, tactical evasion skills, and close connections to organized firearms distribution rings in Puerto Rico and Florida [1][2][3].
- No verified digital footprint or family data surfaced post-2020. Minimal social media references suggest older or spoofed accounts rather than confirmed activity [8].
- As of 2025, the U.S. Marshals have not updated his apprehension status — he remains on the *15 Most Wanted* list with a standing reward of up to \$25,000 [4][10][5].

Open-source intelligence and law enforcement record aggregation show minimal verified data on Raymond Abbott's immediate relatives, but a few key references exist across federal and media profiles connecting him to family ties both in Florida and Puerto Rico.

Additional Context

- No confirmed siblings, spouse, or children are listed in any U.S. Marshals Service documentation or major media profiles [4][5][6].
- FOX News (2015) reports that Abbott grew up in Miami with divorced parents and maintained emotional ties to his grandmother there [1].
- The “Baerga” surname—used as an alias—is believed to trace to a possible maternal family link in Puerto Rico, as suggested in local case references and investigative blogs [7][2].

10	Phoenix, Arizona	5	OSINT link references a Raymond Abbott alias in Phoenix (10633 33rd Pl, AZ 85028); plausibly an identity morph adaptation or misdirection through counterfeit records. [9]

Observational Notes:

- Abbott historically leveraged **island-hopping via small craft**; his known mechanical and tactical skills make rural ports and inland transport nodes viable.
- His **continued interest in weapons trading** suggests ongoing patronage from smuggling networks centered around Puerto Rico and South Florida.
- High-level behavioral review: likely **uses Spanish alias**, maintains low profile with small criminal syndicates, and avoids digital exposure.

This matrix identifies **Tier 1 priority search areas (San Juan–Bayamón–Miami)** warranting radius-based searches for tip correlation and geofencing under NCOUC parameters.
