Indigenous Resilience in the Face of Genocide

A Monument Project

Design a monument that memorializes the ways in which an indigenous group showed their resilience as a nation when confronted with colonization and genocide.

You must imagine what the monument would look like, and draw it out on a poster. You must also include the plaques that visitors to the monument would read to learn about the indigenous nation and the resistance to colonization and resilience to genocide the nation showed. Additionally, you must include a self-created map of the nation's territory, a location for where the monument would be built, and why that location was chosen.

The Monument

- What does it look like? Why did you choose that design? What special symbols are particular to that nation? How can you incorporate those symbols into the monument?
- How do visitors move around or through the monument? How do they view it?
- Where is it located, and why?
- How is information displayed? What do the plaques say?

The Nation

- Where is their homeland?
- Which colonies/states is their homeland a part of?
- What other information can you find about the indigenous nation? (History, culture, government, special rituals, language, etc.)

Resistance/Resilience

- What kind of resistance/resilience?
- What steps were taken?
- Who were the leaders?
- How long did it last? Is it ongoing?
- How was it resolved?
- What is this nation currently doing to preserve their culture?

You must include at least three sources of information

Monument Project Rubric (Worth 21 points)

Your project must be displayed on a poster and have three components:

> Monument and its location

o A drawing and layout of the monument with an explanation of its location

> Plaques/signs

- Written information about the history and culture of the nation
- Written information about how the nation showed resilience/resistance in the face of colonization and genocide

> Map of nation's territory

• Self-made map (not printed from the internet) of the territory the nation's homeland
