Following IPCC Climate Report, Berkeley Activists Slam Governor Newsom's Wildfire Photo Op

Group behind Berkeley vegan transition bill says Newsom's inaction on environmental impact of animal agriculture is unacceptable

AUGUST 9, 2021, BERKELEY, CA - The Berkeley-based grassroots animal rights network Direct Action Everywhere (DxE) has just issued a scathing statement in response to today's dire <u>IPCC report</u> on the burgeoning threat of global climate change. The group -- which led the campaign which culminated in <u>last month's resolution</u> for the city of Berkeley to transition its food purchases to 100% plant-based -- took issue with what they call California Governor Gavin Newsom's <u>hollow words and action regarding</u> climate change.

Almira Tanner, who was elected and has served as the network's Lead Organizer since 2019, issued the following statement.

In this moment -- with the IPCC's dire warning, and as the <u>largest single blaze</u> in California history rages -- it's unacceptable that a Governor and a state touting bold progressive leadership would blatantly ignore the catastrophic impact of animal agriculture.

Governor Newsom talks the talk: yesterday, surrounded by the charred remains of homes, he posed in front of a team of cameras and stridently proclaimed, 'We need to acknowledge straight up that these are climate-induced wildfires.'

Yet in the state with a larger animal agricultural footprint than any other, Newsom shockingly refuses to even acknowledge what the UN called "the world's most urgent problem." Animal ag is a leading cause of greenhouse gas emissions, and we can and we must act now.

We're calling on Governor Newsom to immediately <u>issue an executive order</u> establishing a moratorium prohibiting the construction of more factory farms and slaughterhouses statewide. It's only a necessary first step -- the least that can be done to acknowledge and combat this dire threat while we still have time.

DxE has launched a website in support of its "No More Factory Farms" campaign. It held a <u>demonstration</u> in San Francisco over the weekend to raise awareness of the campaign and related issues.

Investigators with <u>Direct Action Everywhere (DxE)</u> enter farms, slaughterhouses, and other agricultural facilities to document abuses, and to rescue sick and injured animals. DxE's investigatory work has been featured in <u>The New York Times, ABC</u>

<u>Nightline</u>, and a <u>mass pig killing Glenn Greenwald exposé</u>. DxE activists have been <u>subjected to FBI raids</u> and <u>felony</u>

<u>prosecutions</u> for their investigative work. The group also led the 2019 grassroots effort to <u>ban fur products in California</u> and the
