_____ How many inches in a hand	E. Horses of draft-horse breeding (heavier body weight, slower-moving and big boned, with docile temperaments)
_____ Horse Height	F. A female horse that is 4 years of age or more
_____ Pony Height	G. Zoological Classification Zebra
_____ Jack	H. An intact male horse that is 4 years of age or more (horse)
_____ Jenny/Jennet	I. The mother of an equine
_____ Mule	J. Under 14.2 Hands
_____ Hinny	K. Offspring resulting from a jack and a mare (Sterile)
_____ Mare	L. The father of an equine
_____ Stallion	M. A newborn equine of either sex, up to 1 year of age
_____ Dam	N. An equine 6 years of age or older
_____ Sire	O. Includes Horses, Zebras, & Donkeys
_____ Spayed Mare	P. A female horse that has had her ovaries surgically removed, leaving her sterile or unable to conceive or carry a foal.
_____ Gelding	Q. A male equine, whose testicles have been removed, leaving him sterile (unable to father offspring)
_____ Foal	R. A male ass, donkey, or burro
_____ Filly	S. A female foal from birth to January 1 st of the year she turns 4 years of age
_____ Colt	T. Horses of both hotblooded and coldblooded decent
_____ Weanling	U. A male foal, which has not been gelded, from birth to January 1 st of the year he turns 4 years of age
_____ Yearling	V. An equine foal that has been taken from its mother or dam and no longer allowed to nurse
_____ Junior	W. Zoological Classification Horse
_____ Aged/Senior	X. An equine from January 1 st of the year the animal turns 1 year of age to January 1 st of the year it turn 2
_____ Hotbloods	Y. An equine that is 5 years of age or younger
_____ Coldbloods	Z. 4 inches
_____ Warmbloods	AA. Horses of Arabian descent (most modern light-horse breeds)
