# [Reference E] Content Editor's report

The Content Team reached two key achievements in 2021. First, we improved the quality of the magazine. This was done by having a more thorough brainstorming process to encourage different interpretations of the theme. Second, the online team succeeded in producing fresh new online content on a weekly basis. This was done by streamlining the relevant stakeholders (i.e., subeditors, art team,

board, social media) to expedite the online publication process. The sub-editors and senior sub-editors have done a fantastic job pushing the quality and consistency of our work to new heights.

One of the challenges we faced this Semester is reacting and adjusting our workflow to ACT's snap lockdown. We quickly adapted the operation of our team to be fully remote as the ACT went into lockdown. There was an increased emphasis on virtual team bonding to maintain morale during these uncertain and challenging times. During this time, we still operated largely 'business as usual' and produced new online content on a weekly basis and two magazines as per the usual print cycle without delay. The final edition for this year 'Regenerate' is currently at the printers and will be distributed around campus as soon as the ANU re-opens to students.

The team has demonstrated a strong ability to consistently create content in print and online to a high standard, even in the face of challenges posed by the pandemic. As such, the focus for the next Content Editor next year will be to better advertise the magazine, online content, and contributor opportunities around the ANU community. Establishing a stronger presence around campus will further enhance the role of student media as a platform to amplify student voices and a vehicle for building a shared sense of identity at the ANU.

## News Editor's report

This semester has been incredibly busy for the News Team. The sudden ACT lockdown impacted the way that we operate and forced us to adapt quickly to online systems again. I am pleased with how the team responded to the situation and continued to deliver timely and accurate information to the student body.

We hired three News Reporters for the semester, and most of the team has stayed on throughout the year. Those that were on the team at the start of this year really stepped up and helped the new reporters find their feet quickly.

We have branched out this semester and are currently doing a joint TV/News project on the pastoral care services available to ANU students. The hybrid role of a TV/News presenter has allowed for more cross-portfolio delivery of news, and I hope this position continues to be developed in the future.

This semester will be the last that will use the old system of hiring and appointing Senior News Reporters. From 2022, Senior News Reporters will be hired through the same process as other portfolios – through an application process open to the wider ANU community –which will bring all the teams hiring processes in line with each other.

As this is my last semester in Woroni, I would like to thank the News Team for its help this year. As of writing this, we have published almost 160 articles in less than a year. This is a fantastic effort, and the team should be incredibly proud of this achievement.

### TV Editor's report

What a semester! The past three months has seen the TV team excel in the face of significant challenges to production from the COVID-19 lockdown. In semester 2, the team have published 14 videos on Facebook with an average of 3,250 views per video. This is a significant increase in viewership averages from semester one and can be attributed to the dedication of production teams to high-quality video content that is relevant to students and published strategically on Facebook and Schmidtposting. This semester also saw the launch of Woroni's TikTok account which has garnered 7,777 likes, 130 followers and 115,000 views across 8 videos in just the past two months. We are basically TikTok famous...

The COVID-19 lockdown presented significant challenges to TV as access to the office was restricted and production teams were not allowed to meet in person to film. Each production team did an incredible job of quickly pivoting to videos that could be completed remotely. This saw some amazing ingenuity with the use of archival footage, stop motion video, live music recording and animation.

The new role of TV News Producer also saw the production of videos that received some of our highest engagement ever. Most notably, the News Producer led the production of TV's first-ever investigative video news piece, highlighting issues in the ANU's pastoral care system from the perspective of Senior Residents.

I am extremely proud of the efforts of every member of Woroni TV in semester two. It will be difficult to part with the team at the end of the term but I am absolutely thrilled that TV will be left in the capable, talented and thoughtful hands of Clara Ho. Clara has been an outstanding member of Woroni TV for nearly three years and I am sure she will bring her wonderful creativity and inspiring personable leadership to the team as they enter the new year.

## Radio Editor's report

A great pleasure writing this Report – in a period of incredible engagement, and expansion into special content. We bolstered Woroni Radio's role in the wider University community and worked assiduously to expand our reach. A special shoutout to the Radio Team – they've shown incredible resolve and commitment through this tumultuous, and often frustrating period. Achieving great success – our highlight was a panel discussion – 'Trailblazing a Career in Media: Going from the ANU to the World'. This saw 70+ attendees, and four leading journalists narrate their experiences in journalism, from their dabbles in Woroni to news media.

Personal development is quintessential to the Woroni Radio experience, with our Kambri Studio providing much value to our Presenters and Producers. Our Events Officers, Elijah and Olivia – alongside Eric (Executive Producer) worked to deliver 'Acoustics in the Clouds', on Kambri Lawns thru Bush Week with ANUSA. We featured over 12 student artists, across 2 days, and worked to embed Woroni into the emerging artists' environment. Groundwork for a comprehensive DJ development program, were all but complete, and booked in for Week 4 – only for COVID-19 to intervene. An Exams live music party @ the Polish Club, too, will be pushed back into the new year but is one of many exciting dabbles into the campus engagement space. This Semester saw Radio Show Applications swell to 40+, with a decked out schedule nearly every day of the Week.

Latter parts of the Semesters mired by the lockdown saw us expand into the Spotify podcast medium – with 10 shows producing outstanding content. We saw great engagement and registered over 2000 streams across our shows (INCREDIBLE!) and produced over 25 hours of content on mental health, societal discussion, and general candid talk segments. Interviews drove our 'Talk of the University' segment that produced 2 short-videos (3,200 views, and 2,000 views) – and five episodes on the evolving Afghanistan situation, COVID-19, conspiracy theories, and life in lockdown – alongside a special feature of Dami Im (Eurovision finalist). Expect more on this front – into the new year! Our relationship with external stakeholders continues to develop, with Student Youth Network (SYN), the Australian Broadcasting Corporation (ABC), Hindenburg Audio Systems, 2XX Community Radio, and aMBUSH Gallery – being a key focus area of my time as Editor. Into the new year, the Radio Team is working towards a Podcast Incubator – providing industry men

toring to our highest quality shows, and a very transferrable skill. The Team, whose structure, is evolving into many diverse areas, is quintessential part of achieving so much within a small amount of time. Woroni Radio has seen an incredible amount of professionality, this Semester, an attribute I'd like follow thru into the new year and towards the conclusion of my time as Editor. Expect more from me on Training and Development – and if you have any ideas to pitch in, I'd love to hear 'em. I'll be working, with great zest and zeal, to run 2-3 Skill Sessions with industry into the new year. I'm incredibly proud of everyone on this journey, and the Radio Team.
