Keywords (Keywords are the labels of your manuscript and are essential for correcting indexing and searches. Therefore, keywords should represent the content and highlight your article. Use only abbreviations that have been firmly defined in the field (10pt, single line spacing, 1 paragraph)).

Note: The abstract must stand alone, meaning that there are no citations in the abstract. The Abstract should tell potential readers what you did and highlight the main findings. Avoid using technical jargon and unfamiliar abbreviations. You must be accurate, concise, clear, and specific. Use words that reflect the correct meaning. The abstract must be precise and honest. Please follow the word limit (100-250 words). Keywords are the labels of your manuscript and are essential for correcting indexing and searches. Therefore, keywords should represent the content and highlight your article. Use only abbreviations that have been firmly defined in the field (10pt, single line spacing).

Introduction (10pt, bold, Align Left)

The introduction should contain (briefly and sequentially) the general background and literature review (state of the art) as the basis for the new research question, the statement of the new scientific article, the main research problem, and the hypothesis. At the end of the introduction, the objectives of writing the article should be mentioned. They should be represented in the literature review to show the brand news of the scientific article.

Method (10pt, bold, Align Left)

The research method should describe the methods used in addressing the problem including the method of analysis. It should contain enough detail that allows the reader to evaluate the appropriateness of the methods as well as the reliability and validity of the findings.

Result and Discussion (10pt, bold, Align Left)

This section contains the results of the research and its discussion. The results obtained from research must be supported by adequate data. Research results and findings must be an answer or research hypothesis or research question that has been stated previously in the introduction section.

Conclusion (10pt, bold, Align Left)

The conclusion statement should contain a summary and suggestions. The summary should provide examples of answers given to the hypothesis and/or research objectives or findings obtained. The summary should not contain a repetition of the research results and discussion, but rather contain a summation of the research results and findings as expected in the research objectives or hypotheses. The suggestions should present things that will be done next about the concept of further research.

Reference (10pt, bold, Align Left)

All references mentioned should be written in the references using the American Psychological Association (APA) style and organized from A to Z. Cite key scientific publications on which your work is based. Cite only items that you have read. Do not exaggerate the manuscript with too many references. Avoid excessive self-citations. Avoid over-citation of publications from the same region. Check each reference against the source (author name, volume, issue, year). Please use a Reference Manager Application such as EndNote, Mendeley, Zotero, etc. All publications cited in the text must be included as a reference list. Please

ensure that every reference cited in the text is also in the reference list (and vice versa). Make sure that your manuscript has complete references (at least 25 articles with 80% of them coming from reputable journals).

Additional Notes:

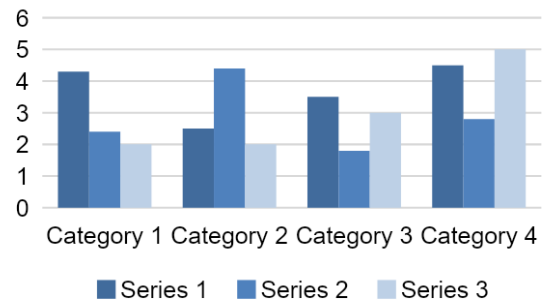


Figure 1. Title of figure (9px)

Tables and figures are placed in the text group after the referenced table or figure. Each figure should be given a caption and source (Figure Caption) below the figure and numbered in Arabic numbering format followed by the title of the figure. Each table should be given a table caption (Table Caption) and numbered in arabic numbering format above the table followed by the table title and source below the table. Figure appendices must be guaranteed to print well in black and white ink (font size, resolution, and line spacing visible). Figures, tables, and charts should be centered between groups of text. If they are larger, they can be placed in the center of the page. Tables should not contain vertical lines, while horizontal lines are allowed only for important points. Please use the term "can be seen in Table 1/Figure 1" to refer to tables/figures.
