

CCHS Alpine Ski Season Recap 2025-26

The Concord-Carlisle Alpine Ski season started off with 77 kids on the roster. After an entertaining dry-land season, we lost 2 to injury, dropping ourselves to 75 students. With epic Instagram posts by Sierra Fonte documenting the season throughout, dryland once again featured team games, relay races, plyometrics, and other fitness activities as we blended our groups into one big team and tried to prepare ourselves for the slopes. This year's dryland was snowier than usual. Not quite enough snow for a safe sledding practice, but just enough snow to make all the other practices a little edgy. Pine Hill run was just as fun as it always is.

January brought us immediately to the slopes. The weather may have been the best in the past six years, as we were able to immediately begin training on gates. The men shot out of the gate quickly, and it was clear from the start that Theo Remington, Jamie Poole, and Jakab Renyi were planning on getting back to States. It was also clear that any number of senior men would be fine candidates to race. As the season wore on, Will Redmond and James Reynolds held down top spots, while Isah Nichol, Nate Johnson, and Declan MacQueen flashed top 20 finishes. Henry Yates (23rd), Max Poulsson (25th), and Finn Ruhmann (28th) also landed top 30 finishes. The young guys tried to get some time with Junior Adrien Guinebertiere, Sophomores Matthew Kusik and Teddy Jiang, and Freshman Kieran Floyd, seeing regular action.

The women had a steady top 6 all season, with Sophomore Julia Reynolds and Junior Juniper Flint leading the way with consistent top 10 finishes. Seniors Maddie Clancy and Elise McMorrow capped off their senior years with strong performances. Sophomores Ceci Clancy and Evvy Hickey continued their growth, scoring points for the Patriots. A large group of freshmen showed up on the scene, with many showing signs of filling roles in the top 6 next year. The future is definitely bright for the class of '29.

After six weeks, the men took the regular season Mass Bay West Omega title, finishing 6-1, with their lone loss coming against Winchester on a tough slalom day for some of the guys. They then capped it off by taking the playoff crown, defeating Weston in the semi-finals and coming out on top against a deep Lincoln-Sudbury team, 48-43. The women, meanwhile, had a strong first three weeks but lost a heartbreaker to Nashoba, 45-44, ending in 4th place. In the semi-finals, they faced the number one seed Winchester. We had a strong race all the way through, with Juniper and Julia landing in the top 5, and we did it! We knocked off the number one seed with a 45-44 victory! We couldn't overcome Lincoln-Sudbury in the final, but we're pleased with second place in the playoffs.

After the league finished, we had the opportunity to hold the Mass Bay All-League Race, combining both the Alpha and Omega divisions, for a fun Friday finish to the season. We raced six men and six women on a giant slalom course, with five of each gender participating in slalom. We took home the men's giant slalom and men's combined titles but fell to second in men's slalom due to a tiebreaker. We also took second in women's giant slalom, third in women's combined, and second overall in team standings. That'll do, boys, that'll do.
