What You Need to Know on Pearl Harbor

- Japan attacked Pearl Harbor in Hawaii and brought the US into World War II.
- Roosevelt cut off Japan's oil supply when they overran French Indochina—Vietnam, Cambodia, and Laos.
- Admiral Isoroku Yamamoto was Japan's best naval strategist, who also had called the attack on Hawaii.
- On December 7, 1941, President Roosevelt requested to enter the war. He called this day the "Day of Infamy" when giving a speech to congress.
- Congress quickly accepted his request for a declaration of war on Japan and its allies.
- All 8 American battleships were severely damaged, with three sinking. The USS Arizona was the worst damaged of them all, and held the most casualties.
- WWII made the United States a leading player in international affairs.
