 - Support writing or accountability groups
- Offer deadlines
- Create a positive environment
 - Feature writing success stories
 - At the University of Arizona we occasionally feature <u>Fellowship</u>

 - Celebrate/share successes: use a tracker to share goals and progress

Enhance Connections within the University

- Create dialogues or cross-disciplinary conversations

 - Connect to library resources
- Embed writing instruction in graduate courses or visit graduate courses
- Present at graduate orientation

- Connect writing and career goals
