## **Countable Nouns:**

- You can count them (1 apple, 2 apples, 3 apples...).
- Use many, few, a few, a lot of with countable nouns.

#### Examples:

- How many apples are there?
- There are **a few** oranges.
- I have a lot of friends.

## **Uncountable Nouns:**

- You **can't count** them. They often come in mass, liquid, or abstract form. Examples: water, rice, sugar, milk, time, money, advice.
- Use much, little, a little, a lot of with uncountable nouns.

#### Examples:

- How **much** water do you drink?
- I have a little money.
- There is a lot of information.
