## **Section 4: Expenses**

Include in this section **all expenses for your project.** Include such expenses as your registration fee or purchase of your animal, medicine(s), veterinary fees, trucking, equipment, insurance, etc. If someone paid for any portion of your project, you will still need to write down the value.
