It allows him to reveal a particular life that shows human flaws in action . It is also in this way that Preston demonstrates the way humans often blind themselves to their own experiences and in creating a negative outlook set themselves up for personal failures. It is in this implication that Preston presents the paradox of the human experience ; he presents a relatable, yet preventable, conundrum.
