

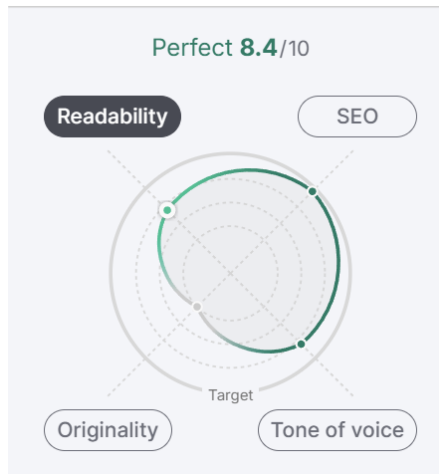

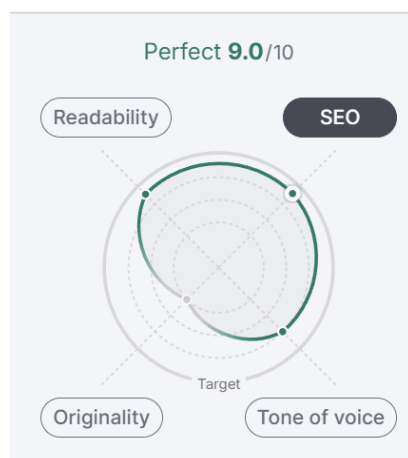

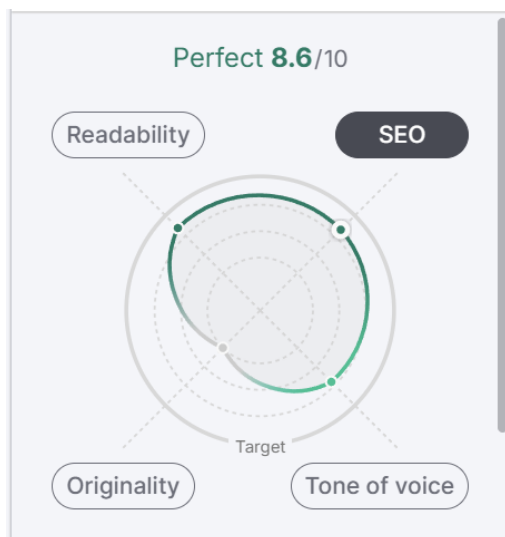
What makes Glendale's caliche soil a challenge for sewer line repairs?

Caliche is a dense calcium carbonate hardpan that runs through much of Glendale's terrain and requires more time and specialized equipment to excavate than standard desert soil. In neighborhoods where mature landscaping sits above the lateral line, that added excavation complexity is one of the main reasons trenchless repair is worth considering first.

Why does the Grand Canal corridor in Glendale create specific drain and sewer risks?

The Grand Canal and New River run through established Glendale neighborhoods, and during intense monsoon storms the surrounding low-lying areas are susceptible to surcharge backups where storm volume overwhelms older sewer connections. Homes near these corridors benefit from a pre-monsoon inspection before June 15 to confirm their drain connections can handle the seasonal surge.

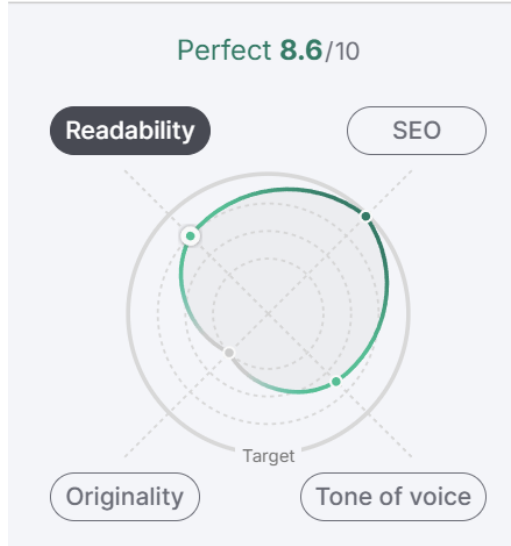

According to the [City of Peoria's Water Services](#) the Greenway Water Treatment Plant, which serves south of Bell Road using Salt and Verde River water from the Arizona Canal, averages 13 grains of hardness. The Pyramid Peak Water Treatment Plant, which serves north of Bell Road using Colorado River water from the Central Arizona Project canal, averages 17 grains. Groundwater wells blended in seasonally run 2 to 8 grains. The mix shifts by neighborhood and time of year. Some parts of Peoria are also served by private water companies including Sunrise, Rose Valley, and EPCOR rather than the City utility directly.

Pipe age varies just as significantly. Vistancia and Pleasant Valley have a median construction year of 2010 and carry modern PVC. [Westbrook Village](#) was developed between 1982 and 1993, and [Crown Point has a median construction year of 1994](#). Homes near Old Town built before 1990 may still carry galvanized steel supply lines, which corrode from the inside over decades and progressively narrow the interior of the pipe until flow drops and clogs become a recurring issue.

For context, hardness in neighboring cities commonly runs 16 to 25 grains per gallon. That difference is real, and it means mineral scale buildup in Gilbert drain lines is slower and less aggressive than in much of the Valley.

That does not mean Gilbert homes are off the hook for drain and sewer problems. Pipe age and root intrusion are still common issues regardless of water hardness. Homes near the Heritage District that predate the 1970s may carry Orangeburg pipe or older clay laterals. Gilbert's

extensively landscaped planned communities create consistent conditions for root intrusion into aging sewer lines. Any pipe can develop structural failures over time. The difference is simply that in Gilbert, hard water is less often the primary driver.

Bounded by South Mountain to the north, Interstate 10 to the east, and the Gila River Indian Community to the west and south, the community's limited access points earned it the nickname the World's Largest Cul-de-Sac long before the Loop 202 South Mountain Freeway opened a second route in. That enclosed geography shaped how Ahwatukee was developed: three foothills villages built primarily from the 1970s through the 1990s, with roughly 23,000 homes that are now mostly past the 30-year mark, all sitting at the base of the largest municipal park in the United States. Hillside terrain, aging infrastructure, and the Phoenix water system all shape what drain and sewer service looks like here in ways that are specific to this community. South Mountain Park and Preserve spans roughly 16,000 acres and is the largest municipal park in the United States, with over 100 miles of trails running through the Sonoran Desert landscape immediately north of Ahwatukee's neighborhoods. That mountain is not just a backdrop. It defines the terrain Ahwatukee was built on, channels monsoon runoff toward residential streets during storm season, and shaped the foothill grading that makes drain and sewer service here more involved than on a flat valley floor property. Most of Ahwatukee's roughly 23,000 homes were built between the 1970s and the 1990s, making them 30 to 50 years old. The infrastructure beneath them reflects that age. Here is what that means for drain and sewer service across the community's neighborhoods:

- **Ahwatukee Foothills:** Hillside-graded lots with longer lateral runs and slopes that affect drainage flow. Homes here are more likely to have aging clay or cast iron lines and root intrusion from established desert landscaping
- **Ahwatukee Lakes:** Flatter terrain near the community's man-made lakes, where drainage grade is less of a factor but older pipe materials and scale buildup from decades of hard water are common

Power Cleaning With Hydro Jetting

Standard snaking clears a clog but does not address the buildup behind it. Hydro jetting scours the interior walls of drain and sewer lines using high-pressure water, removing mineral scale, grease, and root debris that snaking leaves behind. Ahwatukee is served by the City of Phoenix water system, and like the rest of the Valley, hard water mineral deposits accumulate on interior pipe walls over time. In older lines that have been in the ground for 30 to 50 years, that buildup is a consistent factor in recurring drain problems. Rite Way uses sewer camera inspection before and after jetting to confirm the results and flag any structural issues the cleaning reveals.

When backups keep returning after cleaning, something structural is usually happening inside the pipe. In Ahwatukee homes, the most common causes are:

- Scale accumulation in older clay or cast iron lateral lines from decades of hard water buildup

- Orangeburg pipe in the small number of Ahwatukee's earliest homes from the 1970s
- Offset pipe joints on foothill-graded lots where soil movement has shifted lines over time

- Annual camera inspection to monitor lateral condition in older lines across the community's foothills villages
- Hydro jetting to clear hard water scale and root debris before flow becomes restricted
- Root treatment for lines near established desert landscaping and mature trees

That last point is specific to Ahwatukee's geography. Arizona's monsoon season runs June 15 through September 30. Storms that hit South Mountain funnel runoff off the slopes and into Ahwatukee's residential streets faster and in greater volume than flat valley floor neighborhoods

experience. Older drain connections throughout the foothills villages were not always sized for that kind of surge, and a pre-season inspection is one of the simplest steps any Ahwatukee homeowner can take.

Recurring clogs usually mean root intrusion, hard water scale in aging lines, or a structural issue inside the pipe was not addressed by the cleaning. In Ahwatukee's older homes, all three are common.
