A. Introduction

The introduction consists of background, literature review/previous research, basic concepts/clear theories related to the research problem. Researchers must also mention the position of this research related to previous research in the form of suitability, contradiction and/or relationship. Articles must cite the latest previous research, cite articles published in the previous edition of Edukasia Journal and cite articles indexed by international institutions (Scopus/WoS).

B. Methods

An overview of the approaches is provided in this discussion. The key contents of this section are (1) research design; (2) population and sample; (3) data collection techniques; (4) and data analysis techniques. Subjects/samples may use initials.

C. Result and Discussion

The discussion must be written with in-depth analysis and using various aspects of science and its branches. The discussion is also supported by real and clear facts. 3) a critical review that contains a comparison of the suitability or contradiction of the research results with relevant previous research. The main objective is to show the novelty of this article, in addition to showing the scientific characteristics in the form of the continuity of this article with previous research.

D. Conclusion

The references used must be primary reference sources such as journals (including international journals) and proceedings as much as 80% and 20% secondary reference sources (books) published in the last 10 years.
