WORLD HEALTH WORKER WEEK

APRIL 5-11, 2020

Theme: Leaders on the Line

This year's theme highlights the importance of health worker leadership, the need to provide greater leadership opportunities for frontline health workers, and its impact on the front lines of care and the entire world. At the same time, this theme emphasizes how health workers put themselves on the line, often at great personal risk to themselves and their families, to save and improve lives.

Five Actions for World Health Worker Week 2020:

We must ensure health workers on the front lines are adequately equipped and supported and applaud their bravery and leadership.

- 1. Honor and thank health workers for their heroic efforts digitally using #WHWWeek.
- 2. Share our FHWC's Recommendations to Policymakers on COVID-19 with your policymakers. Tell policymakers not to restrict procurement of personal protective equipment and other supplies needed by frontline health workers in low- and middle-income countries and address other issues critical to health worker's safety and support.
- 3. In the US, call your member of the House of Representatives to support House Resolution 467 recognizing frontline health workers' impact in saving lives and battling global health threats.
- 4. Worldwide, donate and ask your governments to support the COVID-19 Solidarity Response Fund and the Working for Health Multipartner Trust Fund.
- 5. Follow @FHWCoalition and #HealthWorkersCount beyond World Health Worker Week for more actions to support frontline health workers.

Key Messages

★ Our Frontline Health Workers Coalition Policy Recommendations on COVID-19 call for immediate policy changes—particularly in low- and middle-income countries—to surge frontline health workforce capacity, ensure their safety and well-being, and make certain their stories are heard and acted on by policy makers.

Frontline Health Worker Leaders

- There's **no health care without health workers**. Frontline health workers are the first and often only link for health services for millions of people in low- and middle-income countries.
- We **need more Leaders on the Line**. The world's facing a dire shortage of 18 million health workers, particularly in low- and middle-income countries. Before #COVID19 half the world's population already lacked access to essential health services.
- We must foster additional health worker leadership by increasing access to leadership training, skills-building, and mentorship programs and addressing gender inequalities in leadership opportunities.
- Frontline health workers put themselves on the line, or at great personal risk, to provide care for others. They are on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic, other infectious outbreaks and emergencies, and also in danger in conflict settings.
- Frontline health workers must be heard and respected. They are often the first to identify and communicate a disease outbreak. COVID-19 is an example of NOT listening to health workers early on.

Women Leaders

- Women make up 70% of the global health workforce yet represent only 25% of leadership
 positions. We need to change this and ensure women health workers have the skills and
 support to step into leadership positions. See <u>more</u>.
- In addition, health care leadership must address workforce dynamics that affect caregivers who are women, including safe work environments, fundamental rights, fair incomes, and integrating unpaid health workers into the formal labor sector.

Nurse and the Midwife Leaders

- We must strengthen nurse and midwife leadership and influence, as highlighted by the <u>Year of the Nurse and the Midwife</u>. Nurses and midwives are already leaders in their communities, facilities, and the health system but are not adequately represented in leadership roles where they can guide health policy and investment. We must tackle persistent barriers nurses face and provide them with the correct support and training. See <u>more</u> from NursingNow.
- World Health Day on April 7 is the launch of the first-ever <u>State of the World's Nursing Report</u> by the WHO, ICN, Nursing Now, and our FHWC member Jhpiego. This report will provide a global picture of the nursing workforce and articulate the role of nurses in achieving UHC, ensuring safer and better prepared communities, enhancing health and well-being, and advancing gender equality.

Advocacy for Leaders on the Line

- We need <u>immediate policy changes</u> to surge & protect the frontline health workforce, particularly in low- and middle income countries. Tell policymakers not to restrict procurement of personal protective equipment and other supplies needed by frontline health workers in low- and middle-income countries and address other issues critical to health worker's safety.
- In the US, call on House members to support <u>House resolution 467</u>, which honors the health heroes responding to outbreaks, disasters, and conflict, and urges greater support for and protection of frontline health workers so they can safely perform their jobs.

- We need more Leaders on the Line. Before #COVID19 half the world's population already lacked access to essential health services, including maternal care, #HIV care, & #FamilyPlanning. Encourage more health worker leaders & make #HealthWorkersCount! #WHWWeek
- Act to ensure #HealthWorkersCount!
 - In US, call House members & ask them to support #HRes467 recognizing frontline #healthworkers' impact & need to invest
 - Globally, donate & ask your gov to support @WHO #COVID19 Solidarity Response Fund & @Working4H trust fund. #WHWWeek
- The stories of frontline #HealthWorkers should be heard and acted on by policymakers. They
 are often the first to identify and communicate a disease outbreak. Sadly, #COVID19
 outbreaks are examples of NOT listening to them early on. #WHWWeek
- We need increased US and global investment in frontline #HealthWorkers—especially in lowand middle-income countries with the least access—to save more lives & ensure our safety. #GHSecurity. #WHWWeek
- Investments in frontline #HealthWorkers can save millions of #MomAndBaby lives, enhance global health security, and result in tremendous economic & social returns! #WHWWeek
- Even once the COVID-19 pandemic subsides, frontline health workers are a critical part of the health and wellbeing of communities. They have the right to a safe workplace, where they can exercise leadership, maintain their own health, and be free of harassment.
- Women make up 70% of the health workforce but hold only 25% of leadership roles. Let's encourage more women Leaders on the Line and ensure women are equitably represented in leadership positions. This #WHWWeek, let's think about #GenderEquality!

- Tackling discrimination in the health workplace--from the top down-- is critical to ensuring a robust pool of #healthworkers. Let's not forget that women make up the majority of the health workforce worldwide: https://bit.ly/2CJXaf5#HealthWorkersCount
- We need teams of frontline #HealthWorkers in every community with the skill mix needed to provide access to the full package of essential health services. #HealthWorkersCount for #HealthForAll! #WHWWeek
